Did you know?

- Famous Residents Phil Drabble OBE, A BBC television presenter and countryman, was best known for long running series 'One Man and His Dog' in which he commentated on sheepdog trials for over 17 years, attracting over 8 million viewers, the queen was even a fan! He was made 'Midlander of the year' in 1992 and made OBE before retiring in 1993. A pub in Bloxwich West's Turnberry housing estate was named 'One Man and his Dog' in his honour.
- Meera Syal MBE Well known British Asian Actress, writer and Comedian born in Wolverhampton but grew up in Essington and moved to Bloxwich when she was young. The landscape and status of being the only Asian family in Essington formed the backdrop of her novel and later film, Anita and Me, which she described as semi auto-biographical.
- Transport Bloxwich West is well served by public transport and has 2 x railway stations.
 Regular bus routes link with Walsall and towns and cities such as Cannock, Wolverhampton and Birmingham and the A34 Southampton/Manchester runs straight through the High Street.
- **King George V playing fields –** Opened in 1937 the site was for Bloxwich residents to play sports. Today, it has football pitches ,outdoor gym, Skatepark, Splash Pads and Childrens play area. Sunday mornings host a Junior Park Run event, aimed at children aged 4-14yrs.



Illustrates Bloxwich West's geography and highlights key local assets.












Bloxwich West's qualifications profile closely resembled Walsall's profile, with a slightly larger number of adults with no formal qualifications (28.1%, Walsall 26.3%) and fewer with a degree or higher (20.3%, Walsall 23.7%).

Claimant Count

- Bloxwich West's Claimant Count (Jobseekers Allowance) is approximately 5.8 per 100 working age adults.
- This is essentially similar to Walsall's 5.3, ranking as the 10th highest claimant rate of the 20 wards.

- Bloxwich West's occupational profile resembles Walsall's but does differ in substantially fewer employed within professional occupations (11.8% contrasted to Walsall's 14.9%).
 The difference in share is largely in greater skilled trades (14.1%, Walsall 12.2%) and slightly more elementary (manual) occupations (14.3%).
- This indicates the labour force of Bloxwich West is distributed more towards manual, unskilled occupations and skilled trades relatively fewer office-based professionals and directors than might be seen across the wider borough.



Deprivation





Bloxwich West's features areas ranking very low in deprivation in the Northeast. However most of the population resides in areas which fall within the 20% most deprived areas in England.

It faces particular deprivation challenges with:

- Adult Skills (decile 2)
- Education, Skills and Training (decile 2)
- Children and Young People (decile 3)
- **Employment** (decile 3)

It ranks positively for close **proximity to services**, falling within the 6th Decile of England areas.



- Bloxwich West's household population of full-time students and school children, aged over 5yrs, is 19.7%, below the Walsall figure of 22.1% and very similar proportion to Willenhall North (19.6%).
- Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children make up 8.3% of households, very similar to Brownhills (8.5%) and Willenhall North (8.6%). The number of lone parent households in Bloxwich West is double that of Paddock (223).
- **55.6% of** Bloxwich West's **homes are owned**. Of those, 57% are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. 14% of households rent privately or live rent free. 1 in 3 homes in Bloxwich West are socially rented, compared 1 in 4 in Brownhills which has the same number of households. At 30.5%, this ranks 7th highest in Walsall.
- The number of households living with **no** central heating across the borough has positively decreased by about half since 2011.Bloxwich West has 7th highest number of households living without central heating, at 1.52%. This is poor when compared to 1.15% homes in Bloxwich East ward, but better than Walsall Borough figure of 1.61%.

Development / Regeneration

- Bloxwich District Centre with national retailers / occupiers and multiple independents.
- District centre improvements works led by Highways completed and included paving works following the demolition of the former public conveniences.
- Former Eagle Public House site derelict for a period of time but flats now under construction.
- Sneyd School site— Planning application being prepared for re-development. Council in discussions with the Community Association regarding relocation before proposed development.
- Bloxwich to benefit from £21.3m Town Deal Funding to deliver significant investment over the coming years. This will include benefits for Bloxwich West Ward. Examples include:
 - Elmore Green Road and Croxdene Avenue Walking and Cycling Improvements (part of the Bloxwich Active Travel and Connectivity project) - already delivered (2023).
 - Planning application submitted to use the former Bloxwich Post Office as a digital support and training facility – Bloxwich Launchpad. The facility will also include space for entrepreneurs to form and grow their businesses.
- Bloxwich Town Deal to continue to deliver significant investment. Projects include the Promotion of Construction Skills Through Regeneration, further schemes within the Bloxwich Active Travel & Connectivity scheme which includes canal towpath improvements between Walsall and Bloxwich. 




Population Pyramid

Key Points:

- Bloxwich West has the 6th highest proportion of people of working age 16-64yrs, and a median age of 41 years old, approximately 2 years above the Borough average (39 years) and 3 years above Bloxwich East. It's age distribution has a higher number of 50-64yr olds than Walsall's Borough population overall.
- In terms of Population Density, Bloxwich West is the 6th most populated ward, with areas of Parks and greenspace, equating to 3,772 people per sq. km, a similar density to that of Blakenall (3,938 per sq. km). Walsall's density is 2,733.
- Due to the narrow population increase since 2011,ethnically, the ward remains largely White British (92%), with small populations of Asian (3%), Black (3%), Mixed (2%). However, both the Asian and Black group have increased, with the Black group showing biggest increase in percentage from 1% to 3%.



- 97.8% of households have all or at least one adult where English is the main language, compared to 81.1% in Palfrey and Pleck. Where English is not the main spoken language, 19% of these residents cannot speak English or cannot speak it well.
- Bloxwich West has a lower number of Households where no residents speak English as main language (86) equating to only 1.5% of the ward, compared to 14.2% of Pleck (788) and St. Matthew's 11.1% (806).

Household residents identified as Christian (Borough 45%)

- Bloxwich West ward has over half (53.0%) of residents following a Christian religion, higher than the Walsall percentage of 45%. It has the highest number of Jewish residents in Walsall and the third highest proportion of residents with no identified religion.
- 39.5% of Bloxwich West residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion, much higher compared to Palfrey ward with just 11.1%.




Non-UK Country of Birth

Key Points:

- With 94.2% of residents being UK born, Bloxwich West has the 5th largest proportion of UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- 5.8% of Bloxwich West's population originates from non-UK nations, contrasted with the borough's 14.7%.
- There are substantially fewer residents whom were born in the Middle East and Asia, at around 179 residents or approximately 1.3% (Borough 8%), but this remains the largest origin for non-UK born residents. There are also fewer from Africa and EU8 (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia).
- There are relatively fewer levels of EU14 born residents as the rest of the borough: founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain, accounting for 0.9% of the ward's population.





Key Points:

- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Bloxwich West features a wide range of segments, with the largest three being Family Basics, Vintage Value and Municipal **Tenants**. These are defined on the right of this page.
- Family Basics accounts for 22% of households: low earning families with limited education, multiple children, poorer quality housing, and little disposable income. It is a segment highly vulnerable to economic shock/crises i.e. fuel/energy, high inflation
- Typical traits the majority of households in this ward share are low income, limited discretionary income and potential for fuel poverty.




Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. The percentage of children in the Bloxwich West ward who reached the expected standard at KS2 is below the Walsall average across all core subjects.

Children are defined as having reached а good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

Maths

The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59%, 57% of children who reside in the Bloxwich West ward achieved this threshold. This is just 2% below the LA average and 8% below the national average. Bloxwich West ward is ranked 13th highest performing in Walsall compared to other wards.

Achieving GCSE English and maths in 2022

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%.

The proportion of students' resident in the Bloxwich West ward who achieved a standard pass is below Walsall and National figures.


34% of students achieved a good pass in English and maths GCSE which shows a 10% gap below the Walsall LA figure and is 13% lower than the National average.











Child Healthy Weight






Bloxwich West ward ranks 9th highest for recorded crime, with a rate of 108.7. This is lower than the borough average, but with variations at a LSOA level.
