Welcome to Palfrey



Did you know?

Etymology - The word 'Palfrey' refers to a small riding horse which is particularly suitable for women.[2] It is possible that Palfrey's name originated from the keeping of such horses on the land which has since become Palfrey.

Landmarks - Palfrey Park is significant landmark cited as one of Walsall Council's flagship greenspaces and the first in the borough to achieve the national Green Flag Award in 2007, which was thereafter retained annually in 2008, 2009 and 2010. It has a reconstructed historical bandstand and Palfrey horse sculpture, created in stainless steel by the sculptor, John McKenna. Palfrey is also home to Walsall's main mosques.

Sports - Palfrey is home to Bescot Stadium, the current grounds of Walsall Football Club, nicknamed 'The Saddlers'. The club was formed in 1888 when Walsall Town FC and Walsall Swifts FC amalgamated to form Walsall Town Swifts. The club's crest features a swift. Bescot Stadium was built in 1989/90 and replaced the football club's previous ground Fellows Park, which was the club's home for 94 years. Their first match result in August 1990 against Torquay United, was 2-2, following an own goal by Walsall after 65 seconds! The stadium was also known as Banks' Stadium from 2007-2022 after sponsorship by the brewery. The stadium has also hosted two music concerts, The Wonder Stuff in 1991 and in June 2015 Sir Elton John played in front of 14,000 fans. It was reported by Express & Star newspaper in June 2008, that the club attempted to sell the stadium to Walsall council and rent it back to secure their financial future, but it was stated the council did not have the funds. In July 2011 council voted 28-24 against purchasing Bescot Stadium.

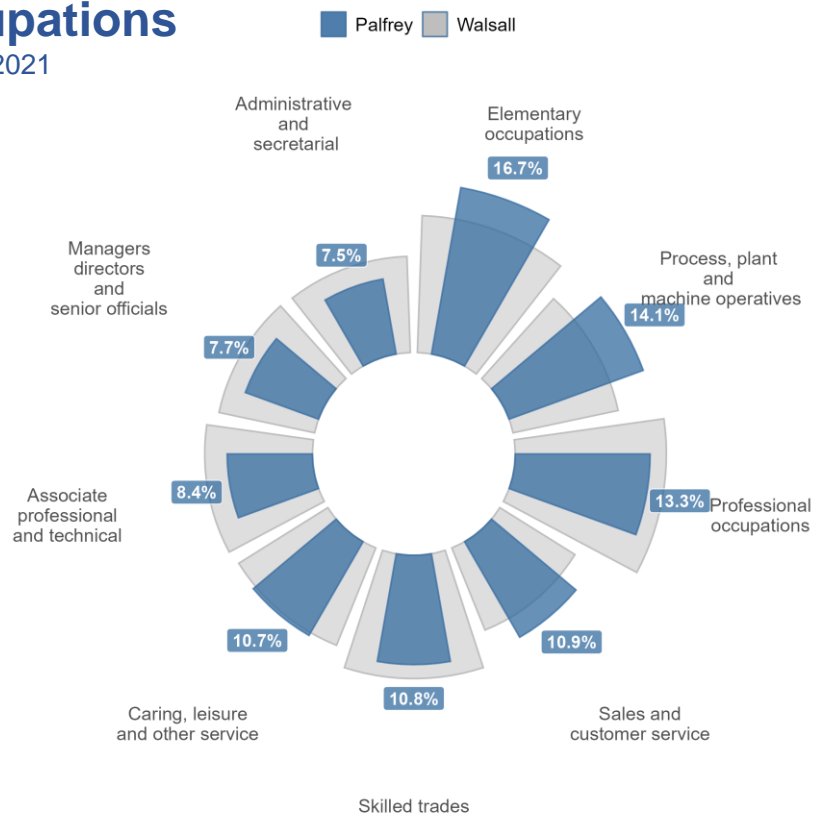

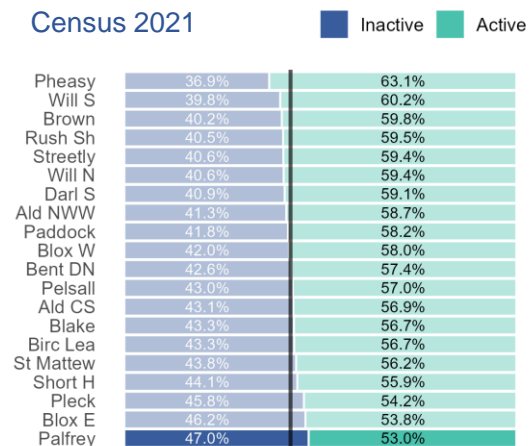

- Palfrey's occupational profile differs from Walsall in some key areas: substantially more employed in elementary occupations (16.7%, Walsall 13.5%), machine operators (14.1%, Walsall 12.6%), and customer services (10.9%). A small proportion are employed within professional occupation, administrative, directors and technical occupations.
- This indicates the labour force Palfrey is distributed more towards manual and unskilled occupations and factory/plant operators with relatively fewer office-based administrative, professionals and directors.

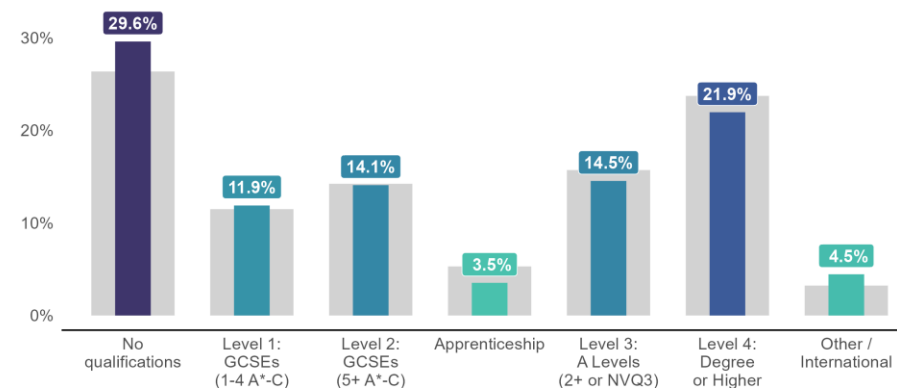

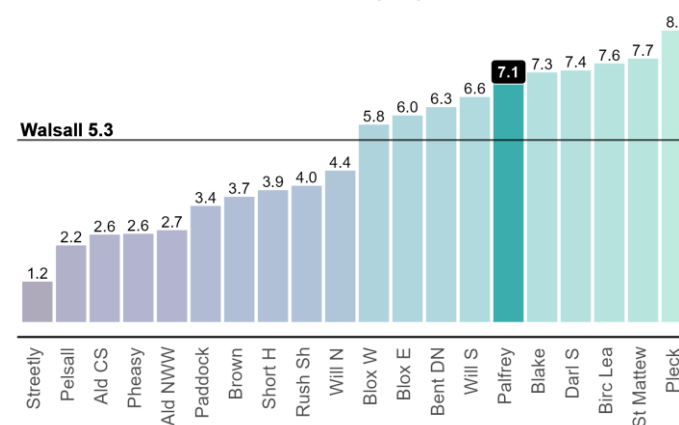

- Palfrey's qualifications profile is similar to Walsall's but differs with relatively more adults (29.6%) having no formal qualifications (Walsall 26.3%), and fewer with a degree or higher (21.9%, approximately 1 in 5 adults). 4.5% have qualifications that are other/international (not recognised).

JSA Claimants per 100 working age pop, ONS Oct 2023



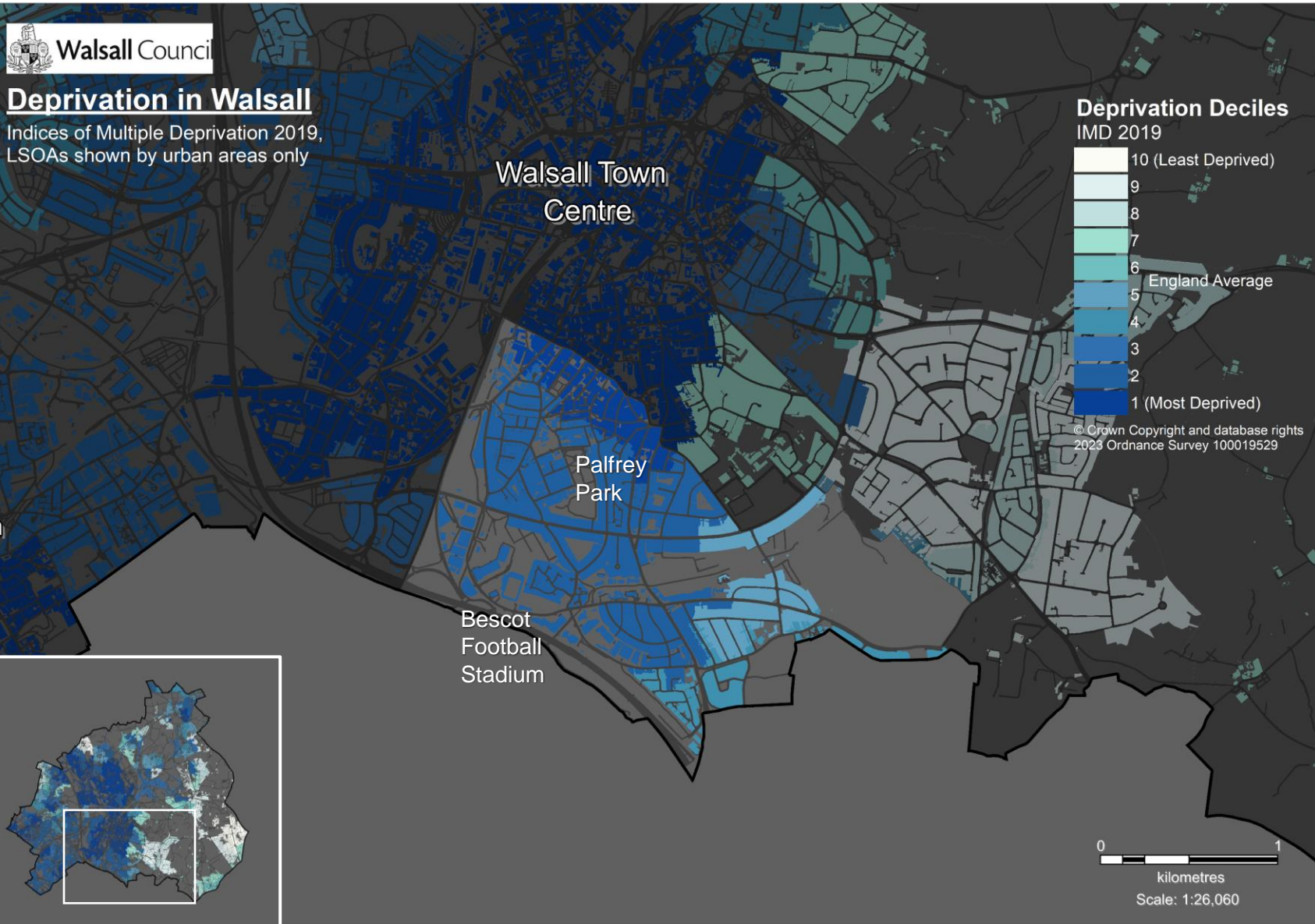
- Palfrey's Claimant Count (Jobseekers Allowance) is approximately 7.1 per 100 working age adults.
- This is above the borough rate of 5.3, and ranks the ward as the 6th highest claimant rate.

Palfrey ranks highly for deprivation, with most of its neighbourhoods falling within the 20% most deprived areas in England (2nd Decile).

Palfrey faces particular deprivation challenges with:

- **Adult Skills** (1st decile)
- **Income** (1st decile)
- **Deprivation Affecting Children** (2nd decile)

It ranks very positively for lack of **Barriers to Housing and Services**, falling within the 8th decile of England areas.



8 in 10 Residents Living in **High Deprivation** Amongst the bottom 20% of areas nationwide.

Note: Deprivation is a relative measure, not absolute. High deprivation suggests an area has not kept pace with progress relative to other areas in England.

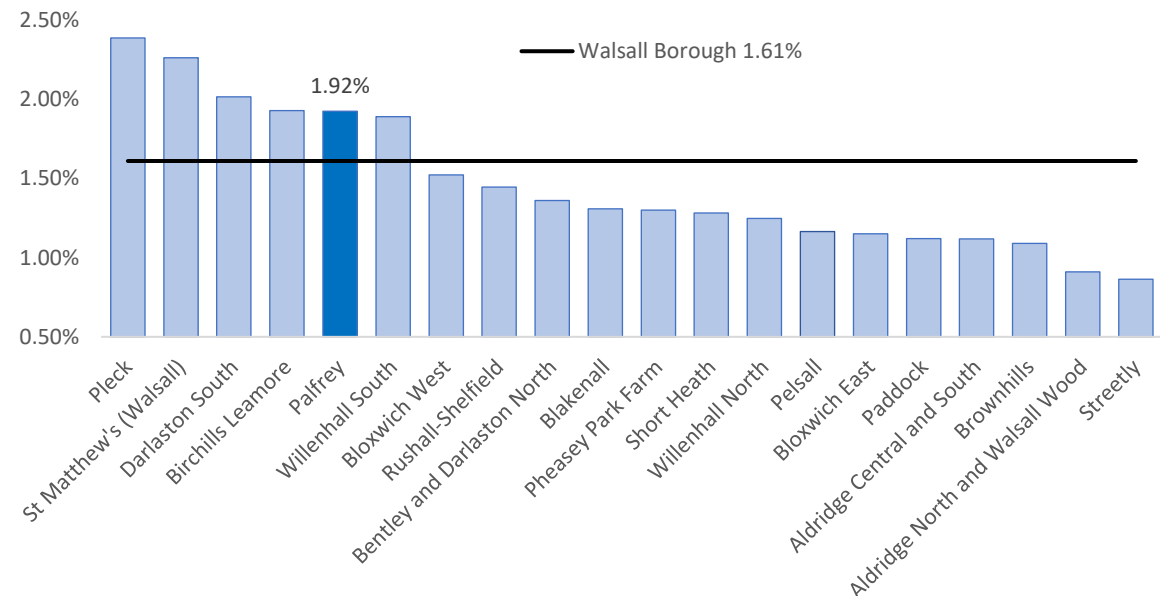

- Palfrey's household population of full-time students and schoolchildren, aged over 5yrs, is **29.7%**, above the Walsall figure (22.1%) and is the **highest** of all Walsall's wards.
- Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children, make up 9.8% of Palfrey's households, this is approximately average in Walsall. The number of lone parent households in Palfrey is more than double that of Paddock ward (223)
- Palfrey has an average number of homeowners – 53.2% are owned. Of those, 52% are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. Palfrey has the 4th largest percentage (24%) of households where residents either rent privately or live rent free. Around 2:9 homes in Palfrey are socially rented (22.4%) just below borough average
- The number of households living with **no** central heating across the borough has positively decreased by about half since 2011. Palfrey has the 5th highest proportion of households living without central heating at 1.92%, above the Walsall figure of 1.61%. Palfrey has 102 households living without central heating, this ranks 6th in terms of number, and double the number of households in Aldridge North & Walsall Wood (51)

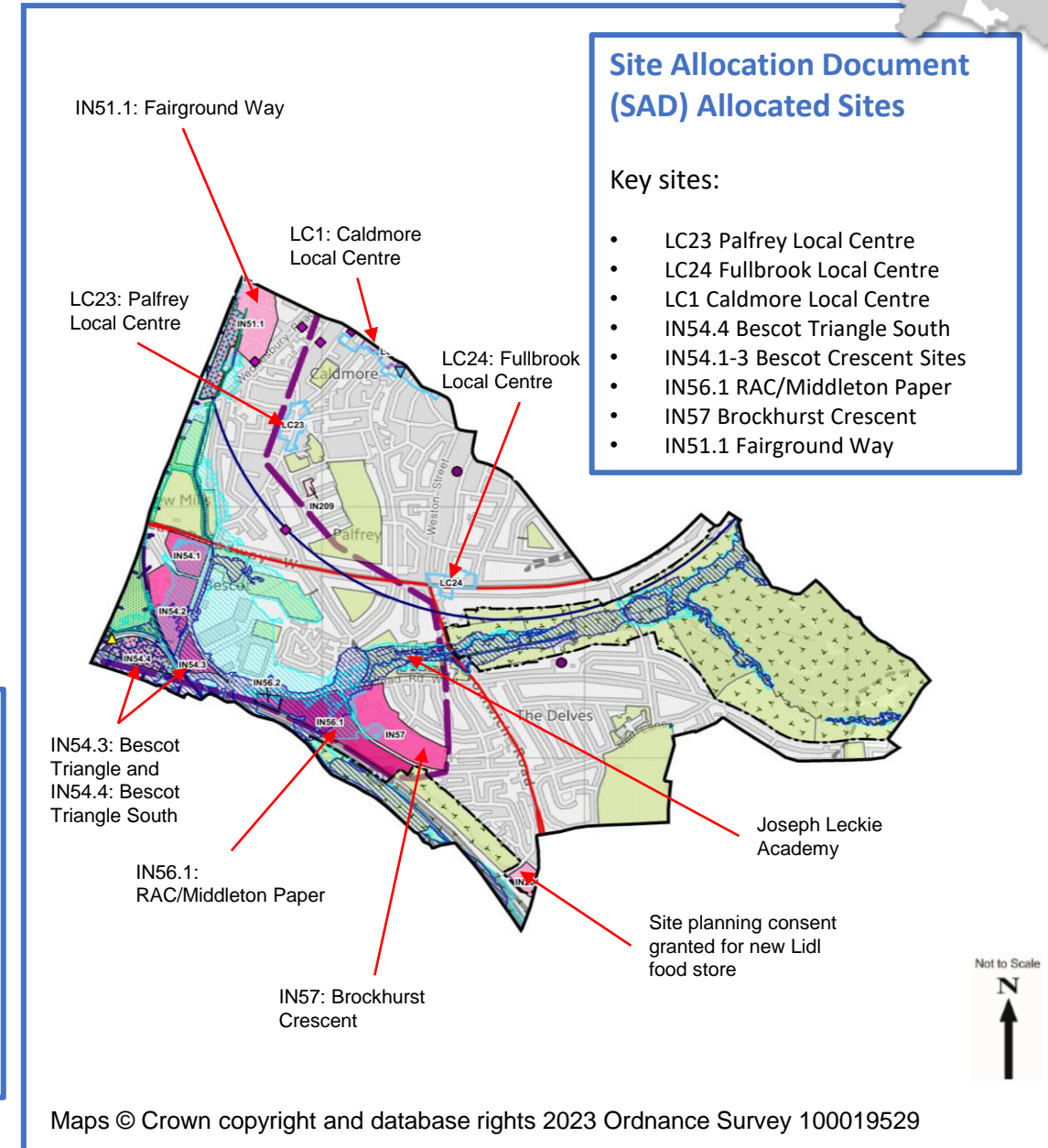
% Households in Ward with no Central heating



Development & Regeneration

- The ward has several **local centres** providing services: Caldmore, Palfrey and Fullbrook as well as Bescot Retail Park.
- **Palfrey Park** is a significant local landmark and is cited as one of Walsall Council's flagship greenspaces.
- Key **businesses** are located in Palfrey including: Barhale, Middleton Paper, and head office of the RAC Group Limited.
- Excellent transport links with **Bescot Train Station** (links to Walsall and Birmingham) and M6, J9.
- Home to **Walsall Football Club** since 1990 with an all-seater stadium capacity of 11,300.
- **Joseph Leckie Academy** provides secondary education. The Academy has benefitted from expansion in recent years.
- **A4148 Broadway/Broadway West** road safety improvements completed in 2023, including central islands and road markings.
- The **former Palfrey CA building** is occupied by a community group providing services for the area.

- Outline planning consent granted at **Bescot Triangle** for an industrial unit and open storage.
- Planning consent for change of use of **Unit 1 & 2 at Bescot Retail Park** for industrial warehouse use.
- Planning consent granted for a **new Lidl food store** at Walsall Road.
- **Former Dale Street Family Centre** demolished (declared surplus to requirements) and will be marketed in due course.
- 4 **EV charge-points** are proposed for installation in 2024/25 for on-street residential EV charging.

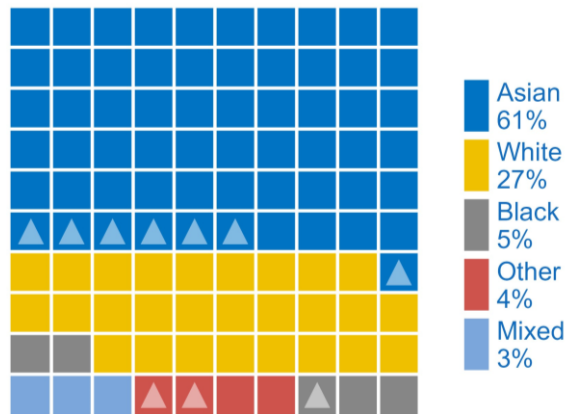

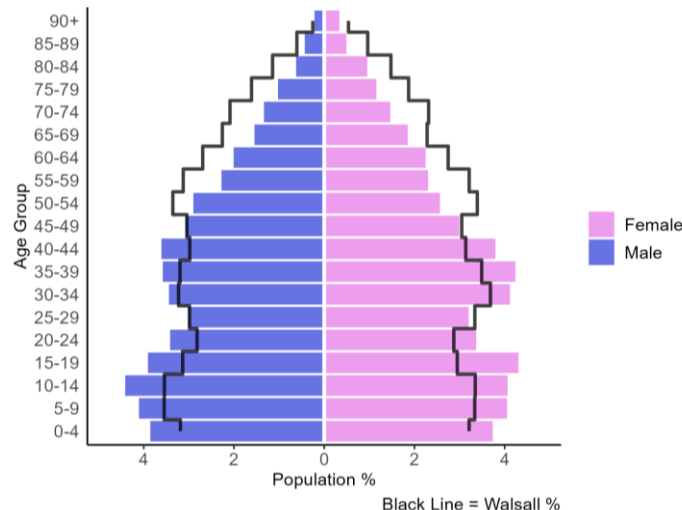

Population Pyramid

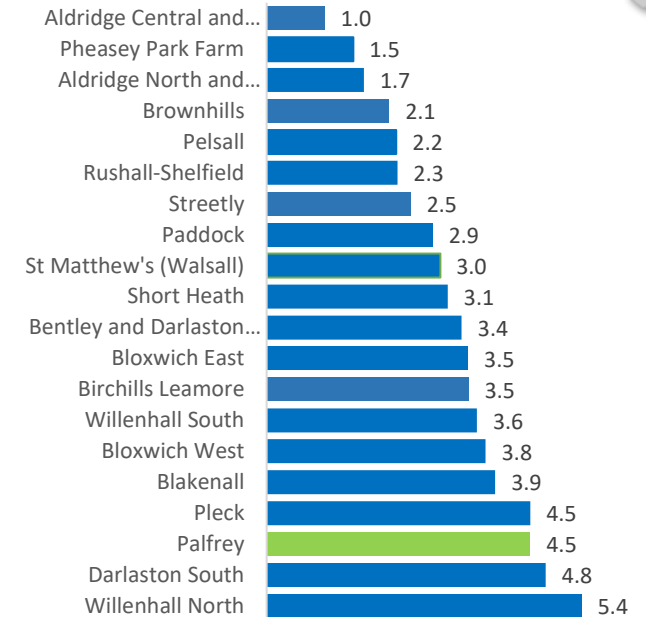
Census 2021, population age and sex

Key Points:

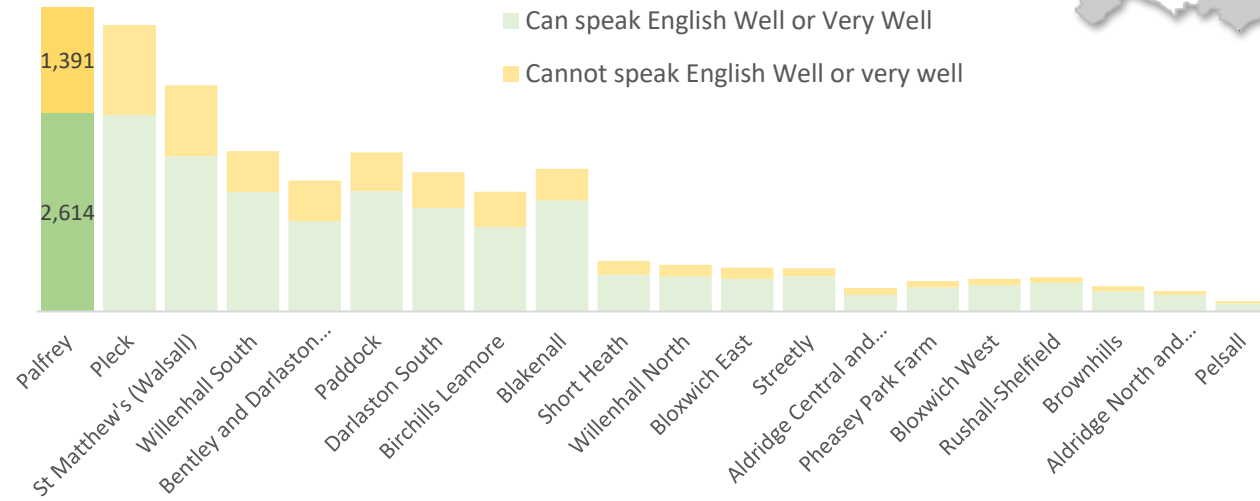
- Palfrey has one of the youngest populations of Walsall's wards, with three quarters of the ward's population aged under 50yrs old and a median age of 33 years old. This reflects a similar age distribution to that in Pleck ward.
- In terms of Population Density, Palfrey is the 3rd most densely populated ward, equating to just 4,542 people per sq. km. For context, Walsall's overall density is 2,733, and Rushall-Shelfield's density is less than half (2,254 people per sq. km)
- Palfrey has a growing population of Asian ethnicity and accounts for the largest group (61%), with an 11% decrease in White group (27%). Mixed group has remained fairly static(3%) while the number and portion of Other Ethnic Group (4%) has doubled since 2011

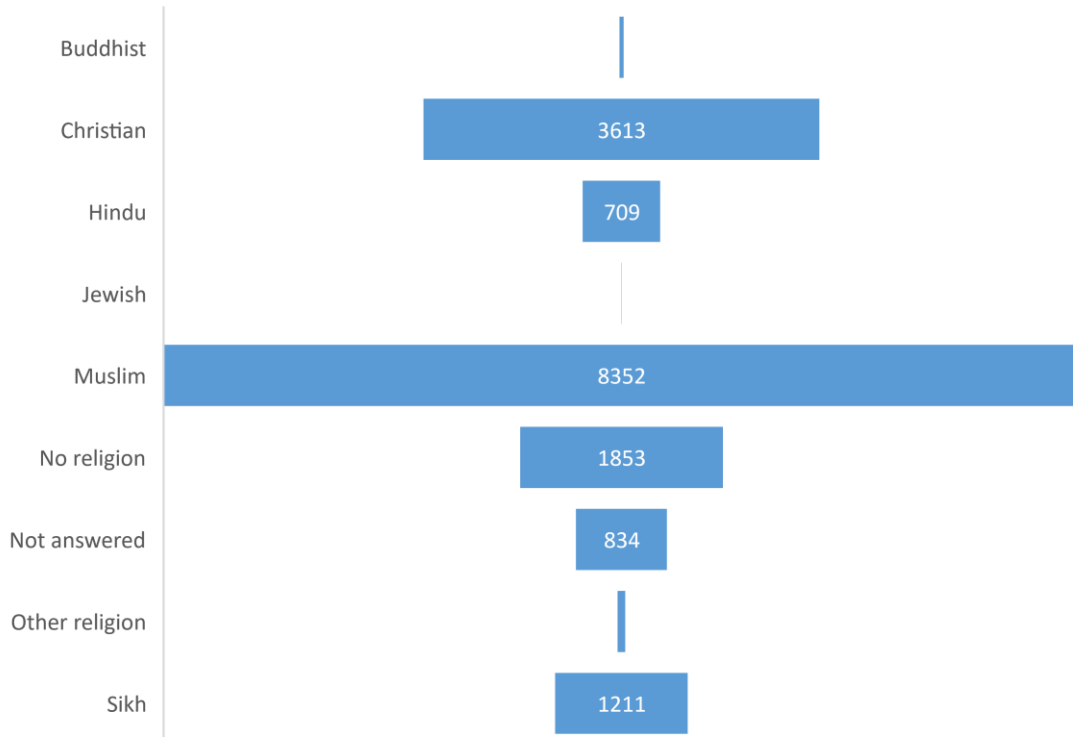
Language and Religion

Population by Religion



- 81.1% of households have all or at least one adult where English is the main language, matching Pleck as lowest in borough and compared to 99.3% of Pelsall households. When English is not the main spoken language in the home, 35% of these residents cannot speak English or cannot speak English well.
- Palfrey has the 2nd highest proportion of non-English speakers in households (752) 14.2% of all households in the ward, compared to only 0.5% in Pelsall (26).

50% household residents are **Muslim** (Borough 11%)

- Half of Palfrey's population of residents are Muslim (50%). This is much higher than the Walsall borough percentage of Muslims at 11.3%. The Hindu population of 4.2% is also higher than Walsall (1.8%) as well as the ward's Sikh community of 7.3%(Walsall 6%) It has the lowest proportion of Christians in Walsall (21.6%)
- Only 11.1% of Palfrey residents are reported as having No Religion. Palfrey has the highest population with identified religions in Walsall, compared with Brownhills, Walsall's least religious ward at 41% reporting No Religion

Global Map of Non-UK Born Residents by Area of Birth

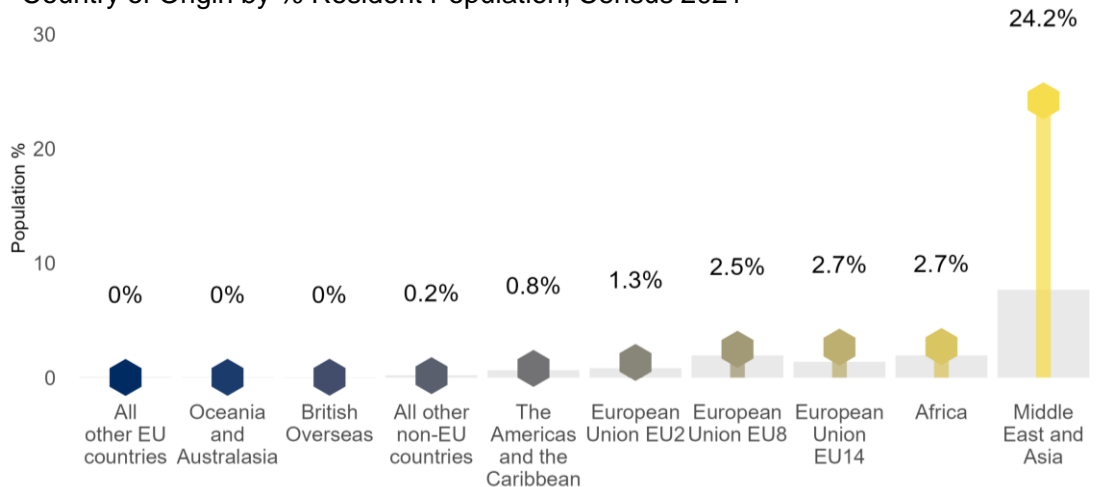

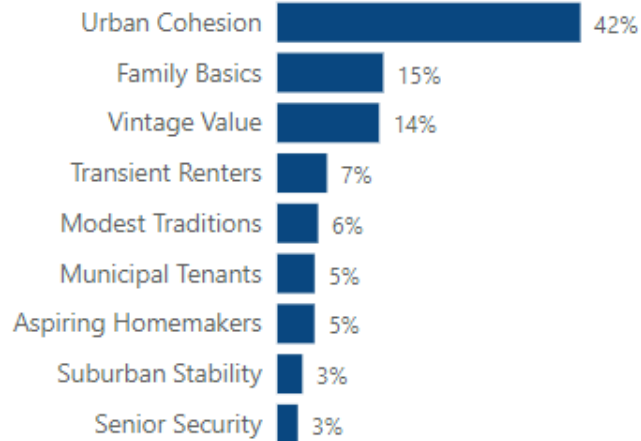
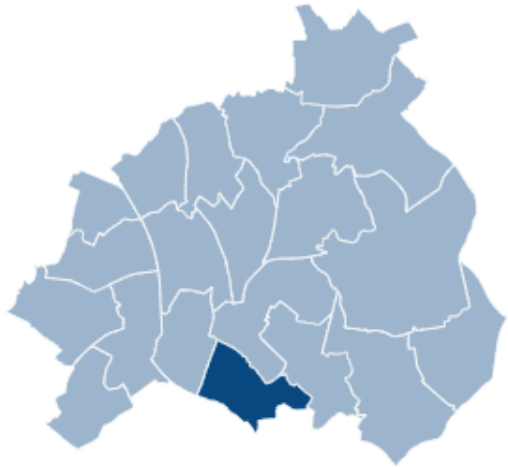
- With 65.6% of residents being UK born, Palfrey has the 2nd largest proportion of non-UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- It has substantially more non-UK born residents, at 34.4% of the population, when contrasted with the borough's 14.7%.
- The largest area of non-UK birth is Middle East and Asia, at around 4,036 residents or approximately 24.2% (Borough 7.9%), which is suggestive of large communities..
- Other non-UK born areas are much smaller: 2.7% of the population was born in Africa, 2.7% in EU14 nations: founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain, accounting for 1.1% of the ward's population (157 residents). 2.5% of the population were born in EU8 (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia).

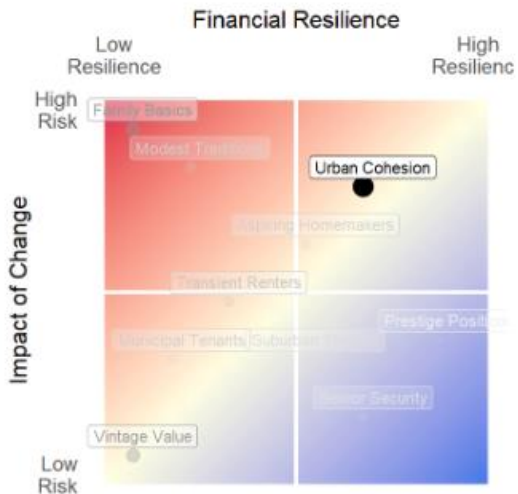


Social Segment Composition of Walsall Wards (% Households)



Key Points:

- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Whilst Palfrey features a range of segments, **Urban Cohesion** is by far the largest, followed by **Family Basics** and **Vintage Value**. These are defined on the right of this page.
- 42% of Palfrey's households could be described as **Urban Cohesion**: diverse urban communities, with a strong sense of identity, making much use of online services, leisure and information. This segment is relatively more resilient to economic shock than others in Palfrey.
- Family Basics** and **Vintage Value** (a combined 29% of households), are segments that, whilst experiencing different life-stages, face similarly constrained incomes and limited educations. They have potential to experience fuel poverty and are susceptible to economic turmoil/crises.

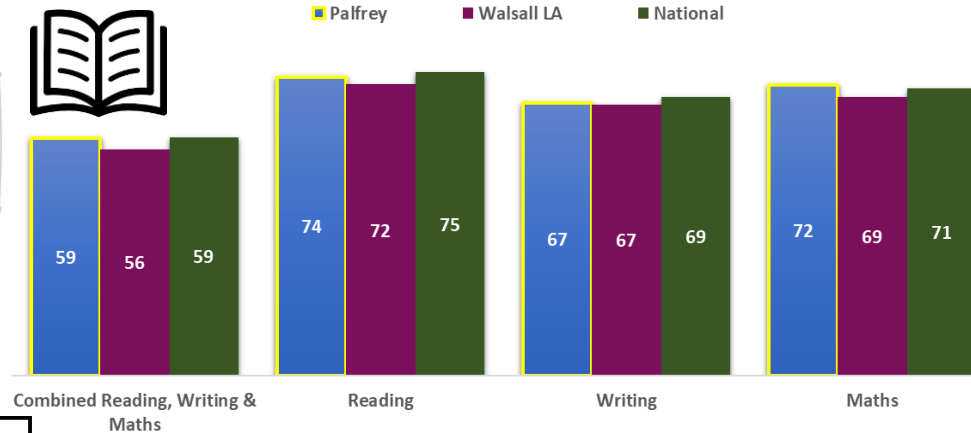

Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

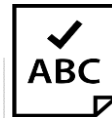
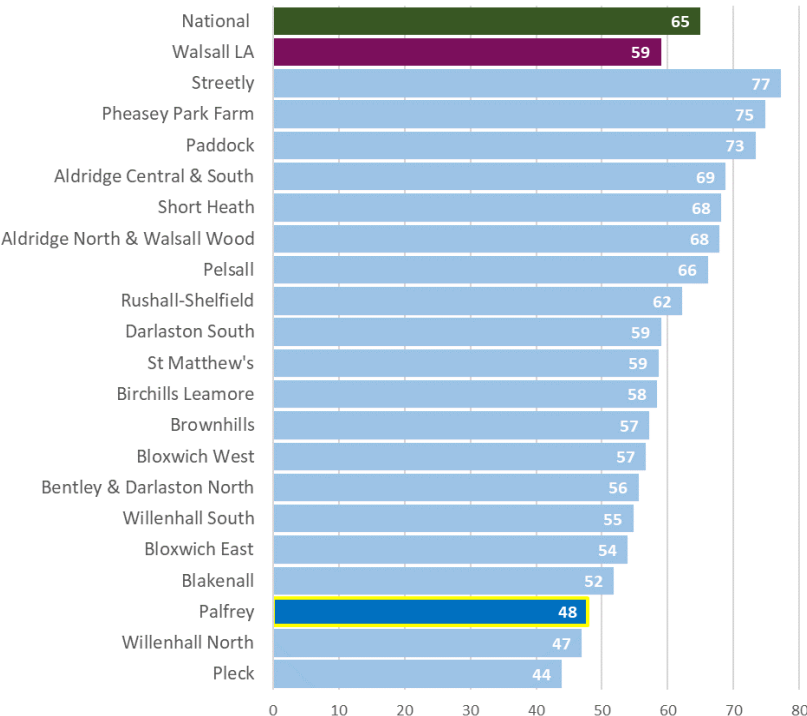
Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. Children who reside in the **Palfrey** ward achieve better outcomes than Walsall overall in Reading and in maths, achievement is higher than the National average.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. A higher proportion of students' resident in the **Palfrey** ward achieve the standard pass at GCSE. (69%).

More students who live in the ward achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE than locally – 5% higher than the Walsall LA figure and 2% higher than the National average.

% Children who reached a good level of development in 2022

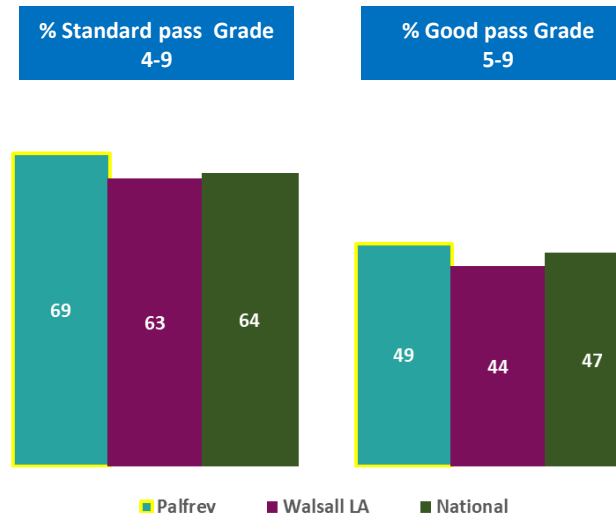


Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59% compared to 48% of children who reside in the **Palfrey** ward. This is 17% lower than the national average and 11% below the Walsall average. **Palfrey** is ranked 3rd lowest achieving ward in Walsall.

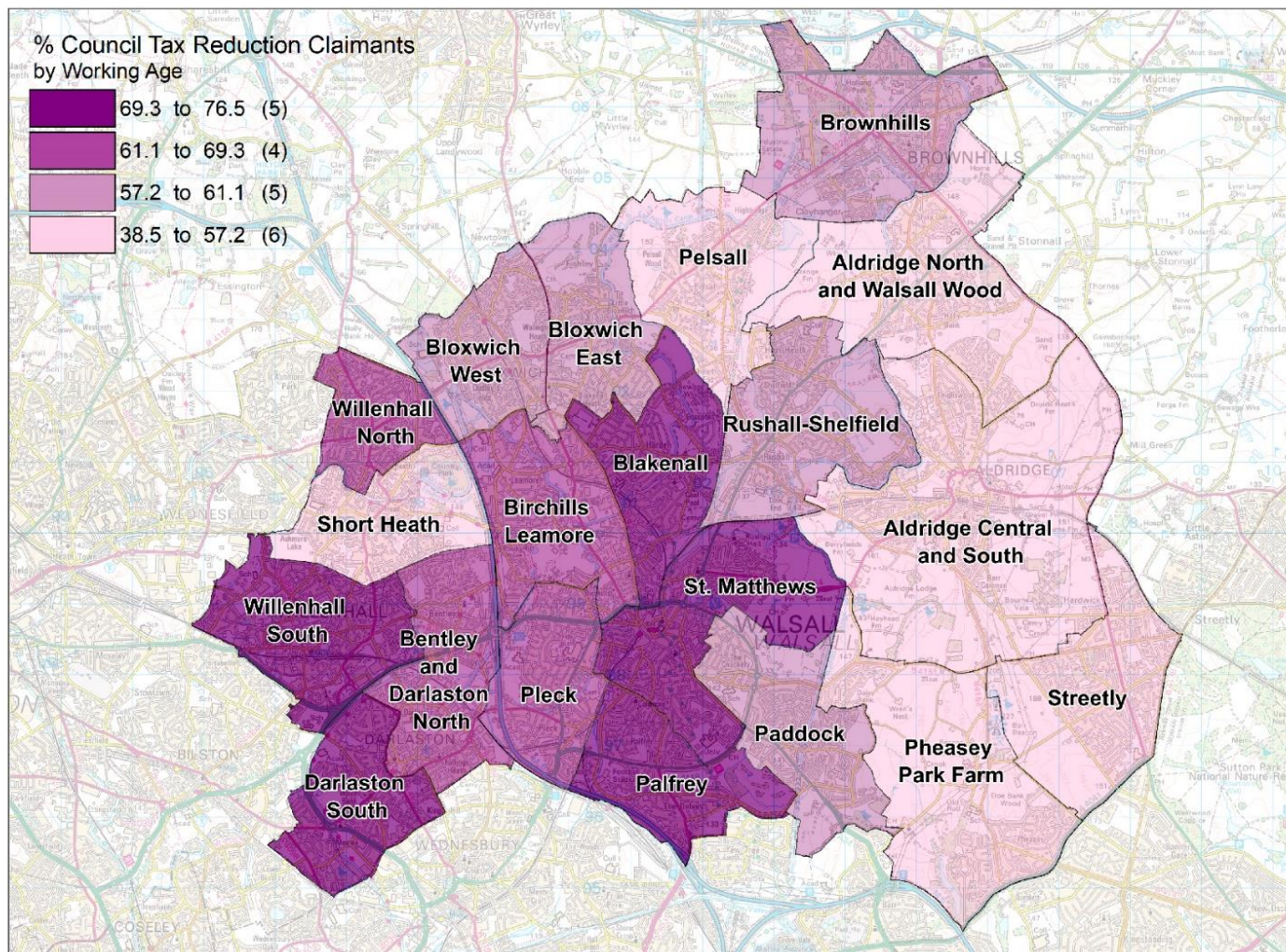


Achieving GCSE English and maths in 2022

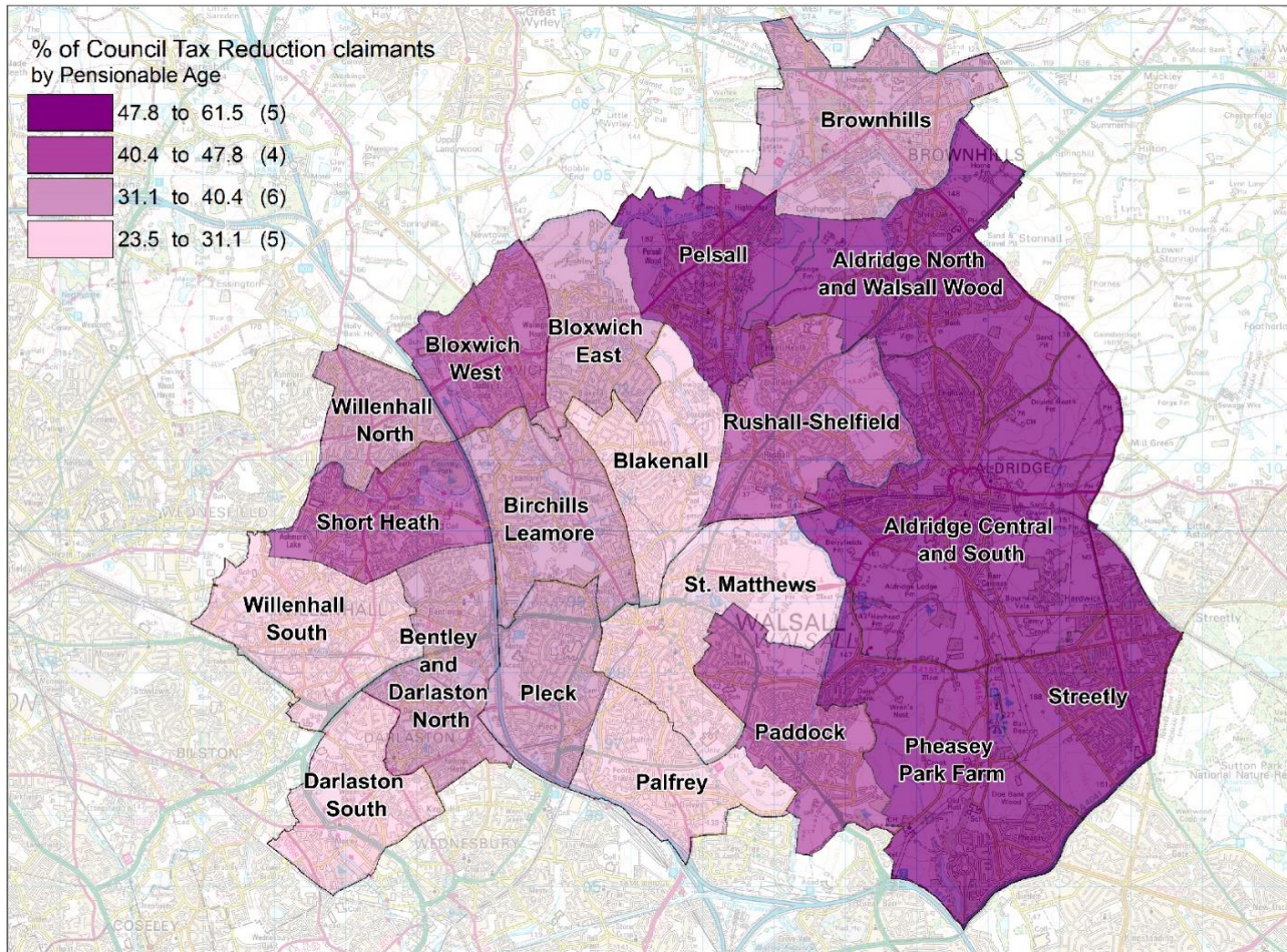
Council Tax Reduction (CTR) household claimants – working age

30.7% of households in Palfrey ward claim CTR by pensionable age, which is lower than the Borough average of 35.9%.

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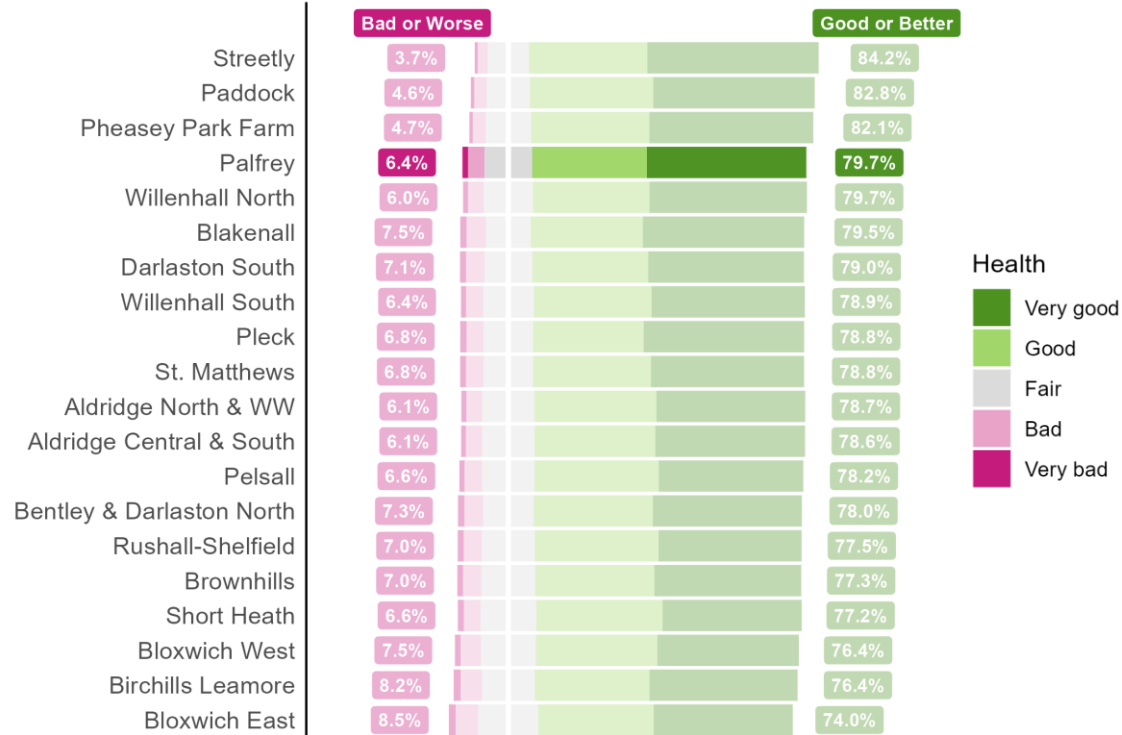

- Palfrey's residents report their general level of health as 79.7% being rated good or better, ranking 4th highest of all Walsall's wards, albeit below the England average of 82.1%
- At 6.4%, approximately 1 in 16 residents reported living in poor health or worse.

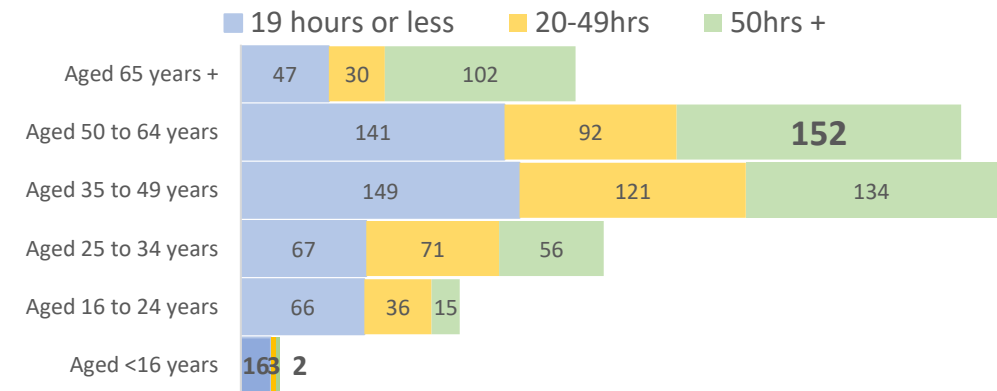

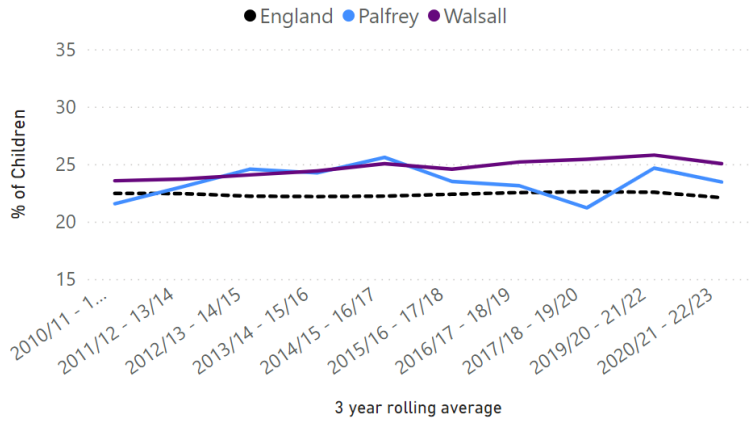


- Palfrey ranks average for number of Unpaid carers in Walsall, 1,300 compared to Pheasey with fewest (1,044) & Aldridge Central & South with most (1,471)
- **8.4%** of Palfrey residents provide weekly unpaid care. This is Walsall **lowest** proportion of carers in all wards. However, higher numbers of young carers (21)

Child Healthy Weight

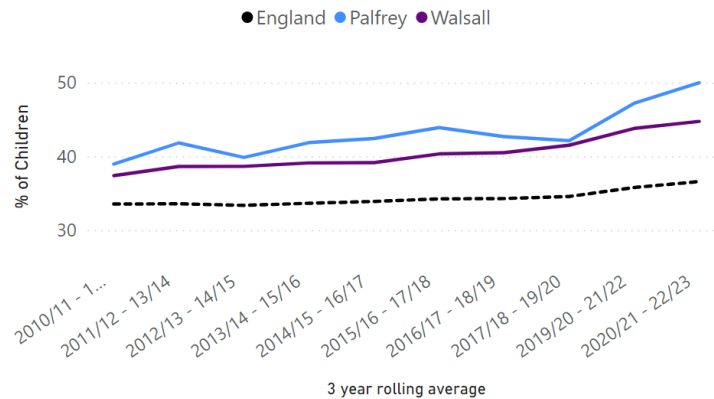


Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Reception Year



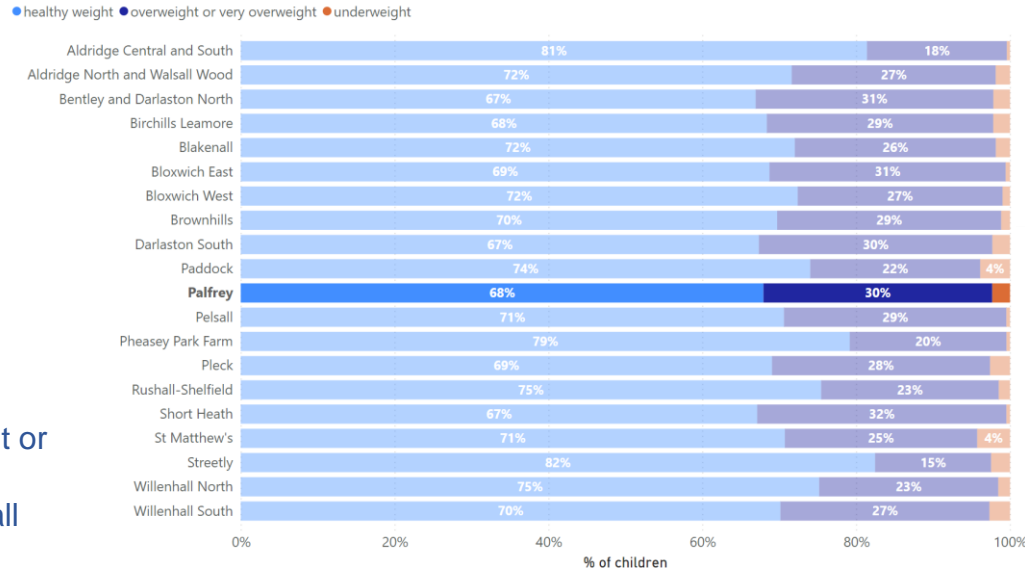
The prevalence of Reception-aged children who are overweight or obese in Palfrey has remained stable in the most recent years, but has increased since 2020. The rate is lower than the Walsall average, but higher than the national rate.

Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Year 6



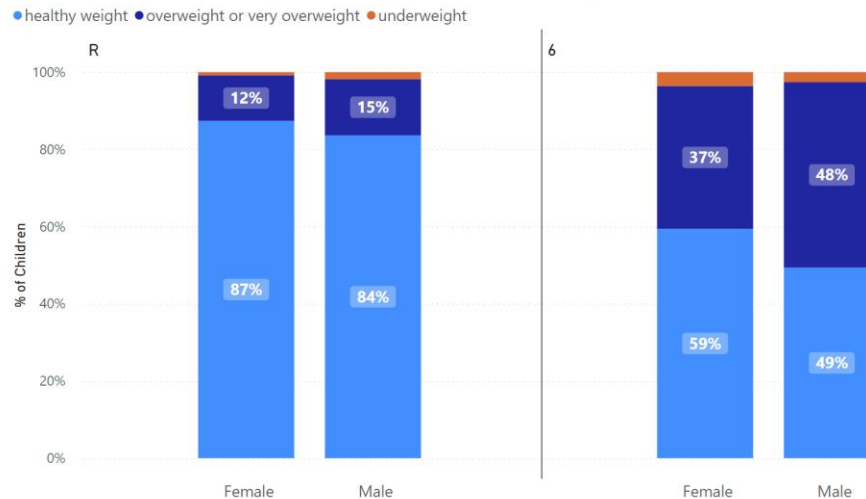
However, the prevalence of Year 6 children who are overweight or obese in Palfrey has sharply increased in trend and is higher than the Walsall average and the national rate.

In Palfrey less than **7 in 10** children are a healthy weight and 1 in 3 children are overweight or obese.

In Reception-aged children in this ward, more than 8 in 10 children are a healthy weight in both sexes.

However, by Year 6 almost half of boys are overweight or obese, which is a significantly higher proportion than girls, where the rate is 4 in 10.

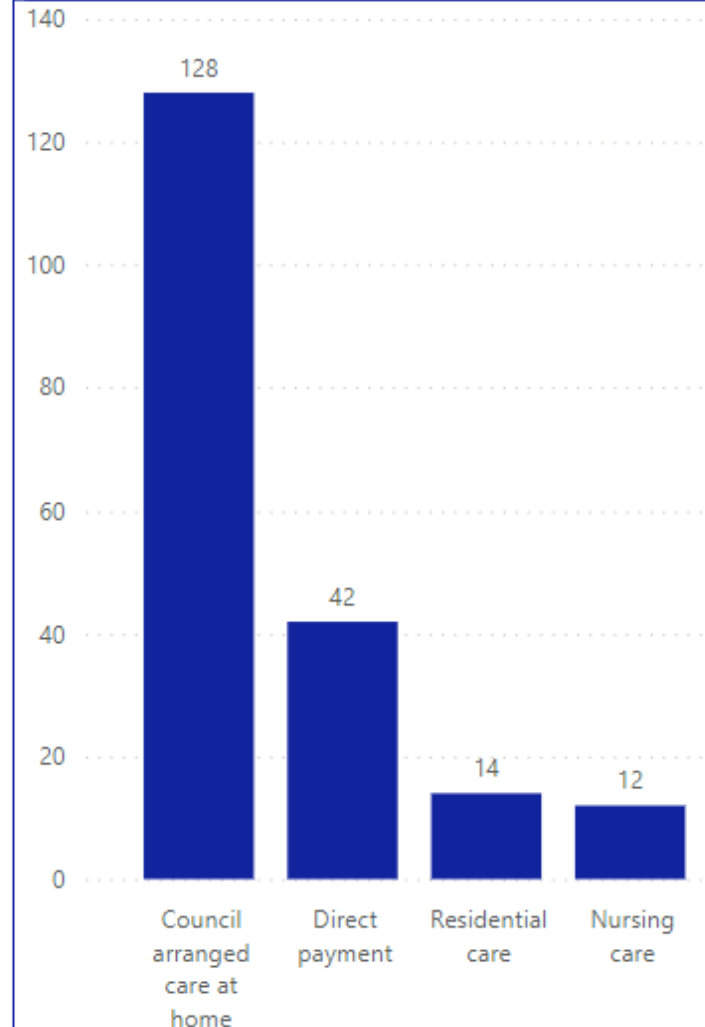

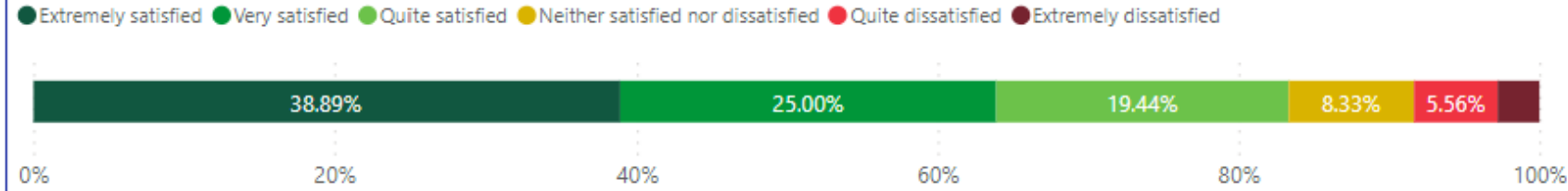

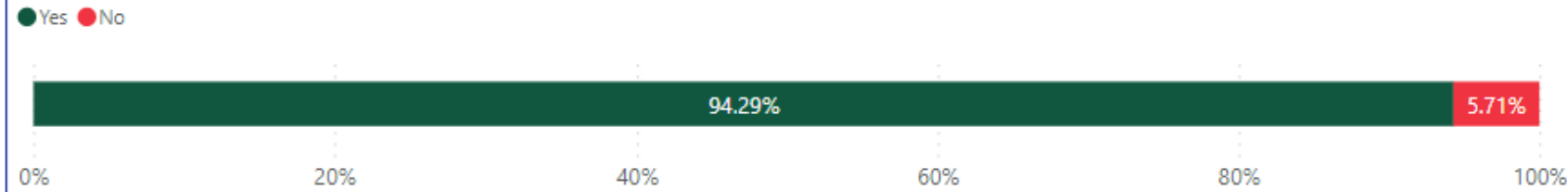
Respondents by age and gender



How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the care and support services you receive?



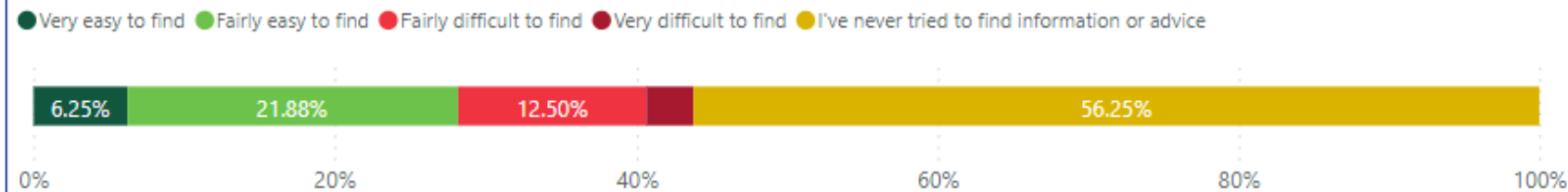
Do care and support services help you to have a better quality of life?

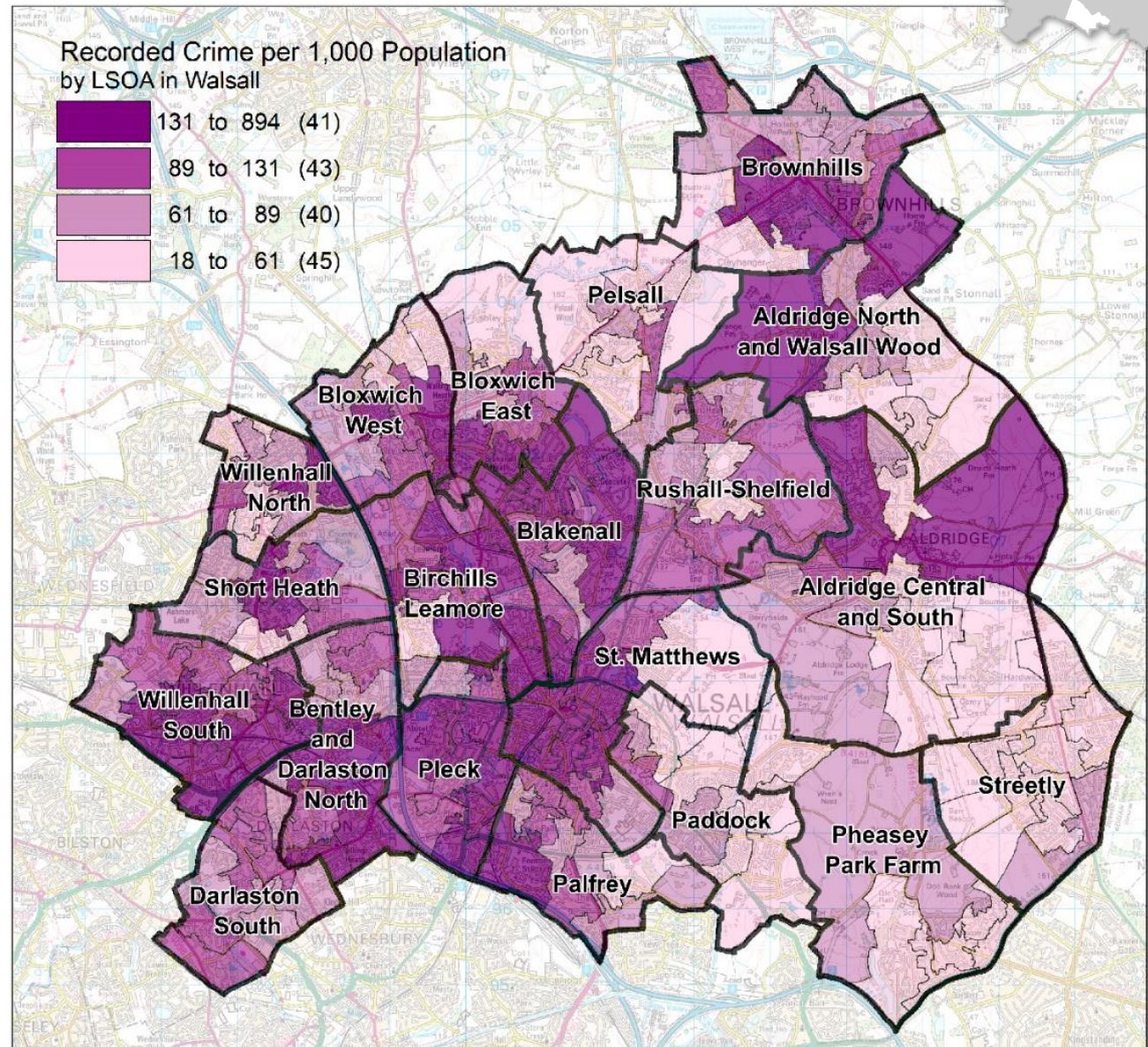

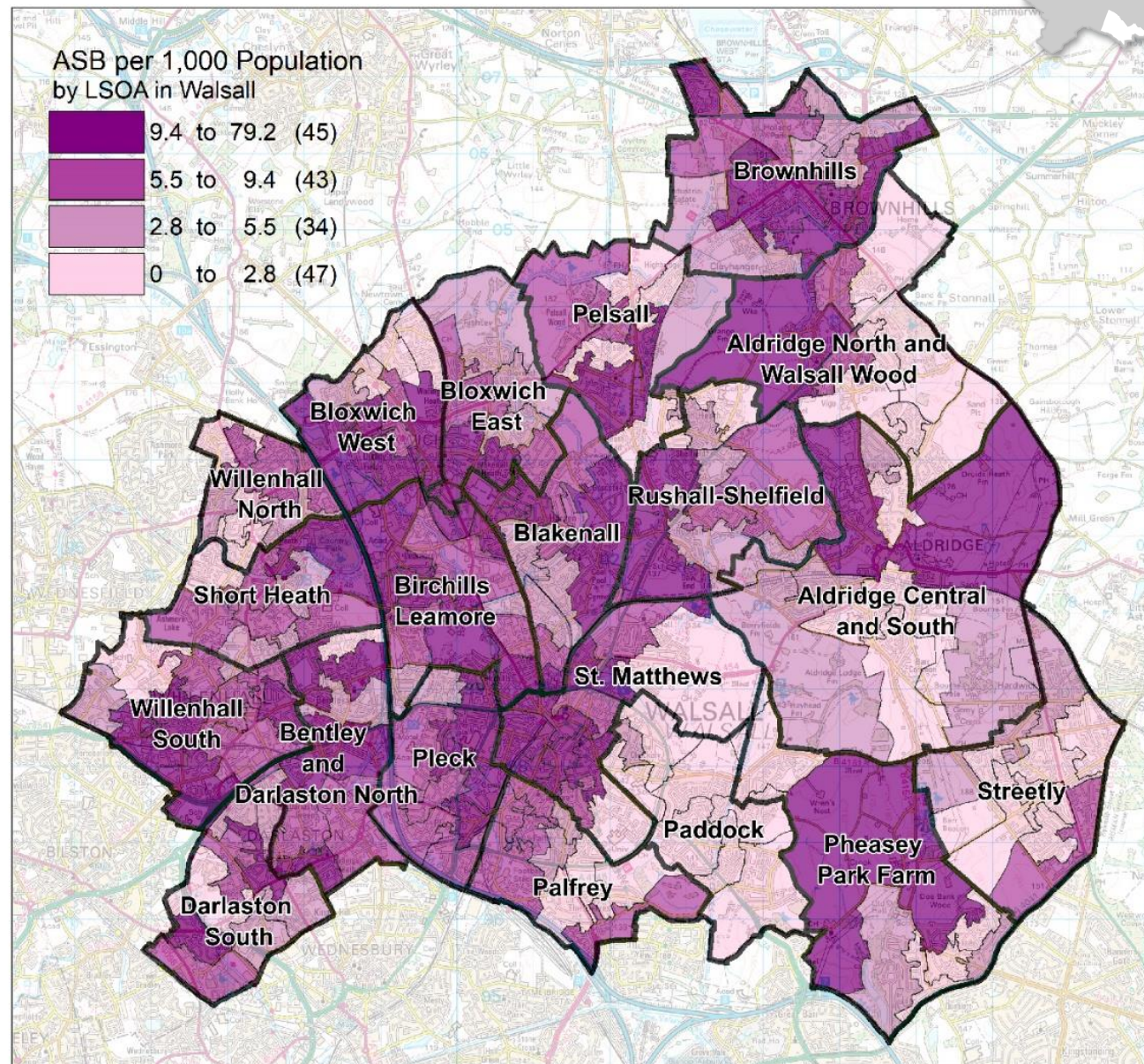
