# Welcome to Short Heath



## Did you know?

Historically, the area around Lane Head and Sandbeds had a thriving mining community.

Remembrance Day parades run from the British Legion building down Church Rd through Lane Head to the cenotaph located on the junction of Sandbeds Road and Haley Street.

Willenhall Lawn cemetery is located on Bentley Lane.

West Midlands Premier Indoor Karting and Laser centre venue is based in Lane Head providing corporate events, childrens parties and racing competitions. There is also a Childrens Indoor soft play centre.

The Duke of Cambridge Pub was converted from 17<sup>th</sup> century cottages around 200 years ago. It has original wooden beams decorated with pump clips, a wood burning fire and hosts live music and traditional pub games. The Whimsey Inn is a 19<sup>th</sup> century local pub serving popular pork and stuffing sandwiches and guest beer is normally 'Olde Swan Bumble Hole' Bitter.

Short Heath has the largest Oak woodland in Walsall, known as Rough Wood and Bentley Haye is a wet grasslands, together they form Rough Wood Chase Local Nature reserve.

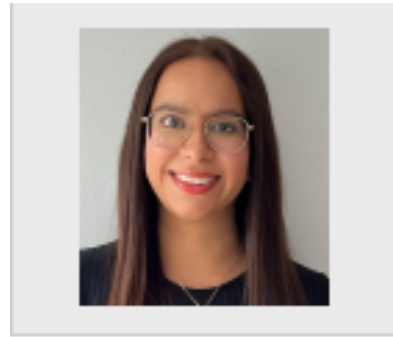

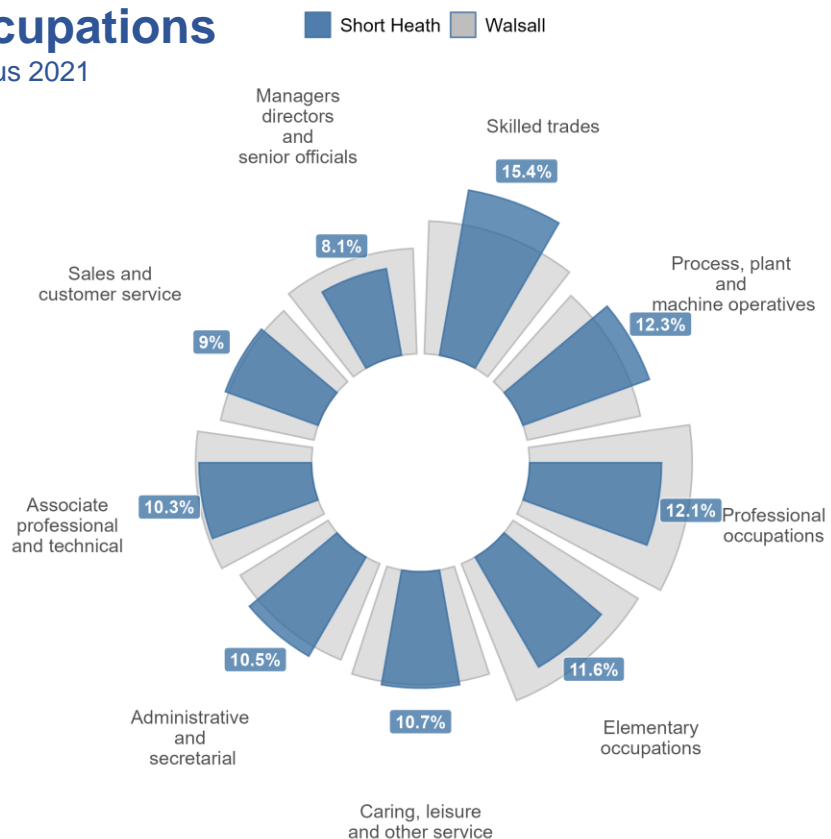

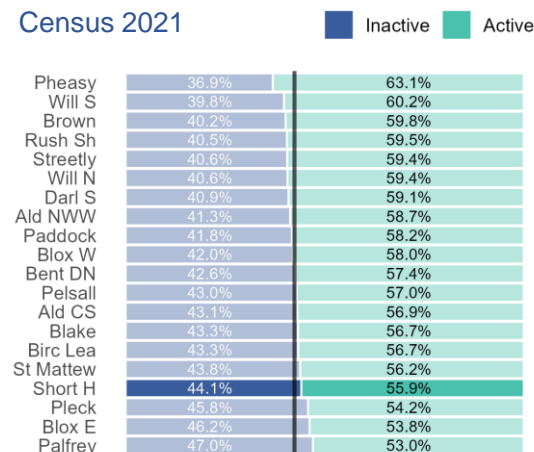

- Short Heath's occupational profile features higher employment in skilled trades (15.4%, Walsall 12.2%) and plant/machine operatives (12.3%, Walsall 10.6%). There are relatively fewer professional occupations (!2.1%) and elementary 11.6%).
- This indicates the labour force of Short Heath is distributed more towards skilled trades and industry – machine operators, and further from professional, office-based occupations and relatively unskilled elementary labour.

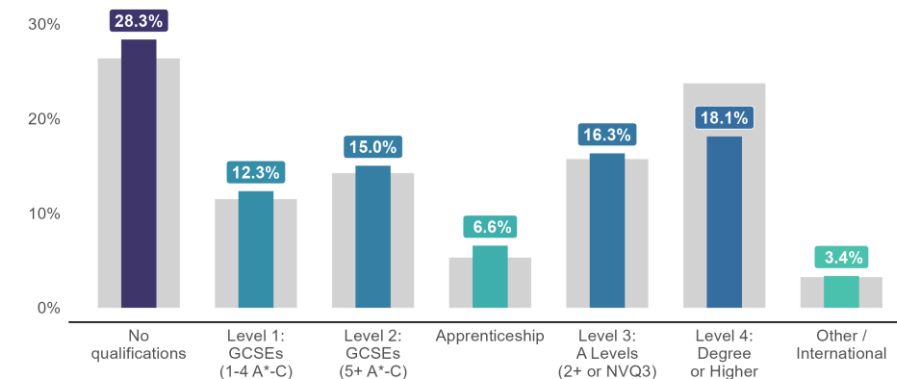

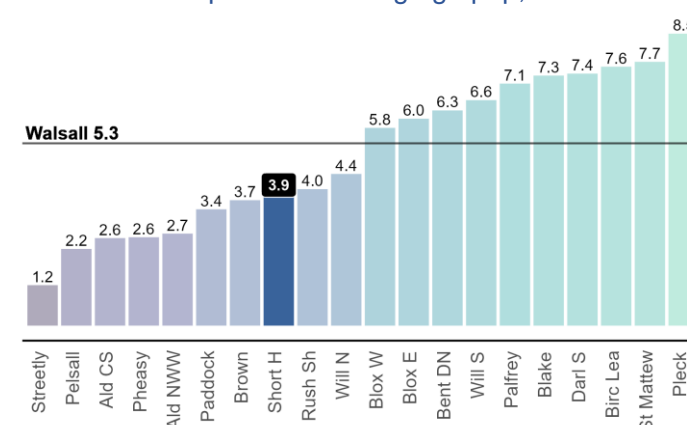

- Over 1 in 4 (28.3%) Short Heath adults have no formal qualifications, higher than the Walsall borough (26.3%). Fewer have a degree or higher (18.1%, Walsall 23.7%). Apprenticeships are relatively higher at 6.6% - likely commensurate with the prevalence of skilled trades.

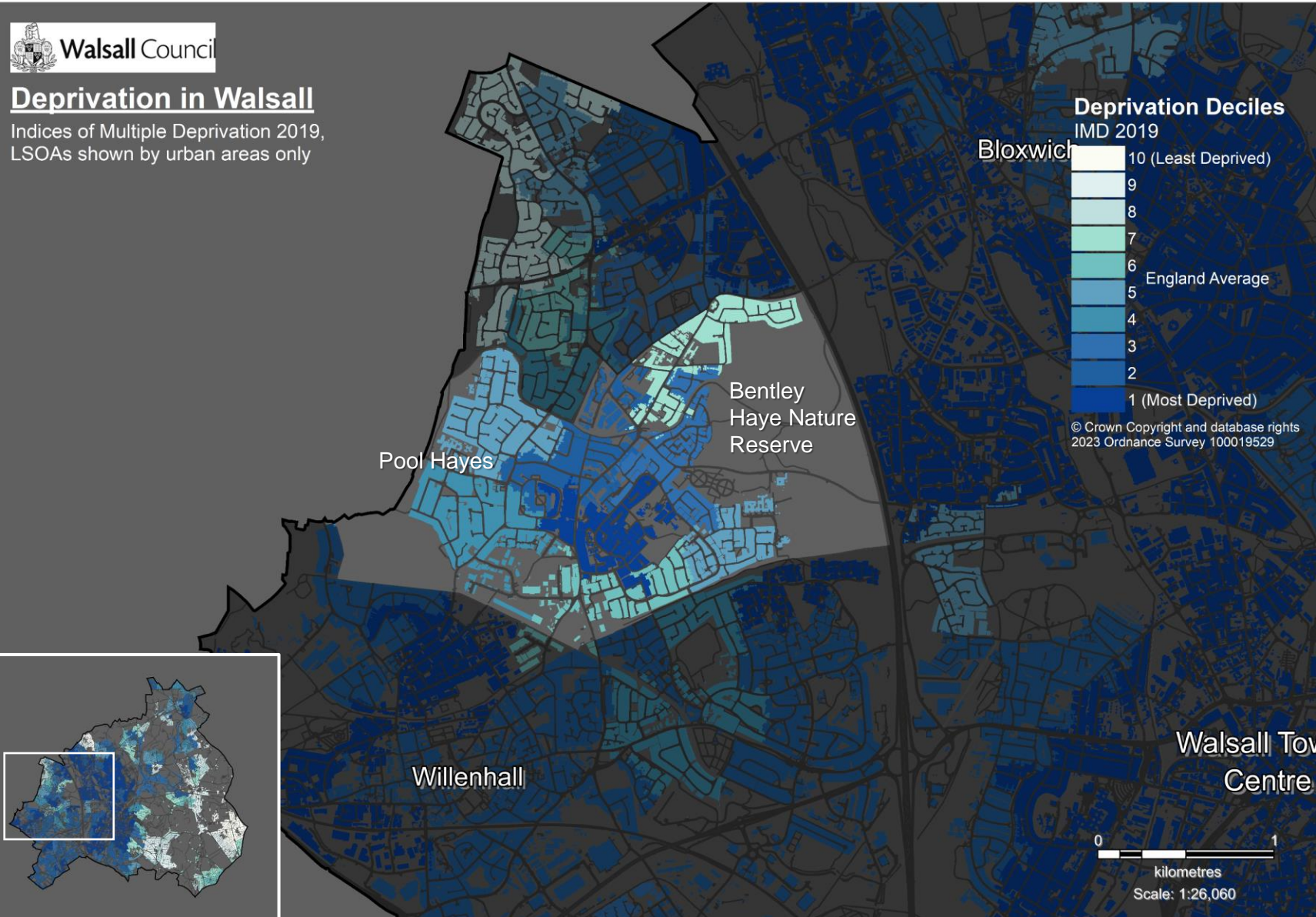

Short Heath is a moderately deprived area, featuring in the bottom 40% of areas in England.

Short Heath faces particular deprivation in:

- **Adult Skills**
- **Outdoors i.e. Air Quality and Road Accidents**
- **Crime**
- **Health and Disability**

All within the 2<sup>nd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> decile relative to other England areas.

However it does rank positively for few:

- **Barriers to Housing**

Within the 6<sup>th</sup> decile, when compared to other areas.

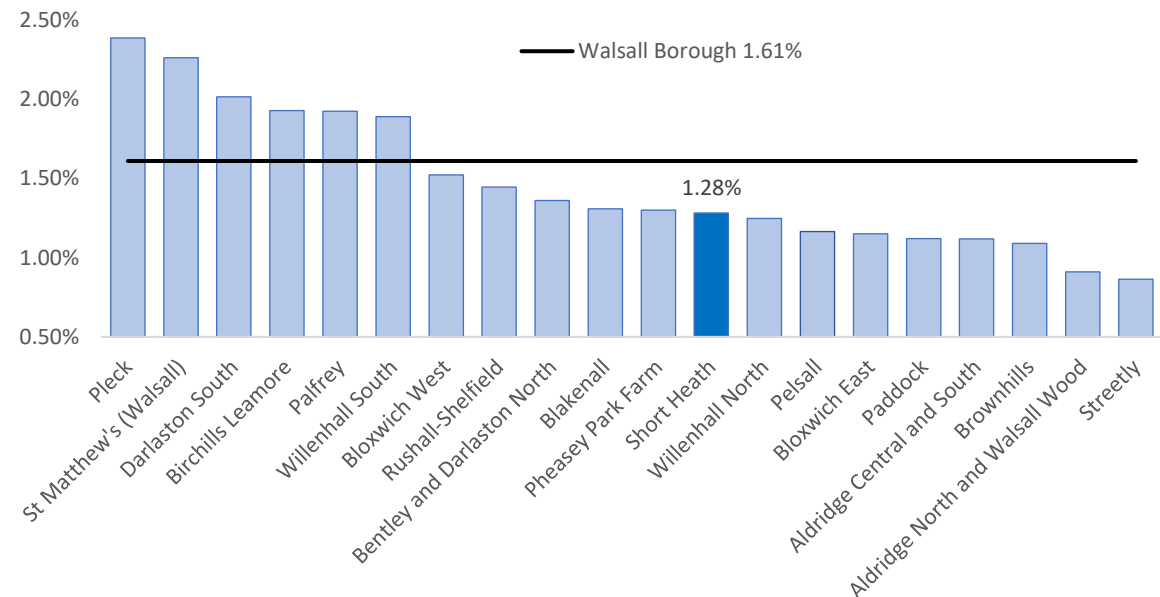

- Short Heath's household population of full-time students and schoolchildren, aged over 5yrs, is 17.3%, matching Aldridge North & Walsall Wood, and below Walsall at 22.1%.
- Lower number of Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children, making up 6.4% of Short Heath's households. This ranks 5<sup>th</sup> lowest in borough and on par with Pheasey Park Farm. The number of lone parent households in Short Heath is approximately half that in St. Matthews ward (614).
- Higher number of homeowners - 70% are owned. Of those, **61% are owned outright**, without a mortgage or shared ownership. This is highest in borough, with Pelsall having 60.3%. 13% of households rent privately or live rent free. One in six homes are socially rented (16.8%), **7<sup>th</sup> lowest** in Walsall (23.7%) and has around the same number of socially rented homes as Aldridge North and Walsall Wood.
- The number of households living with **no** central heating across the borough has positively decreased by about half since 2011. Short Heath ranks 9<sup>th</sup> least number of households living with no central heating at 1.28%. This is better compared to 2.39% in Pleck, but poorer than Streetly with only 0.86%.

# Development / Regeneration

- Well established **residential area** with access to open space including Rough Wood Chase **Local Nature Reserve**.

- Number of **local centres** providing a range of services: Lane Head, Woodlands and Brackendale.

- Strong presence of **industrial uses** e.g. Ashmore Lake.

- Number of **key Walsall businesses** are located in the area including DX Freight and Midland Pressure Diecasting.

- **Beatwaste Site, Bentley Lane** – former landfill site in green belt, formerly proposed for employment allocation in Black Country Plan. Planning application has been submitted which is under consideration.

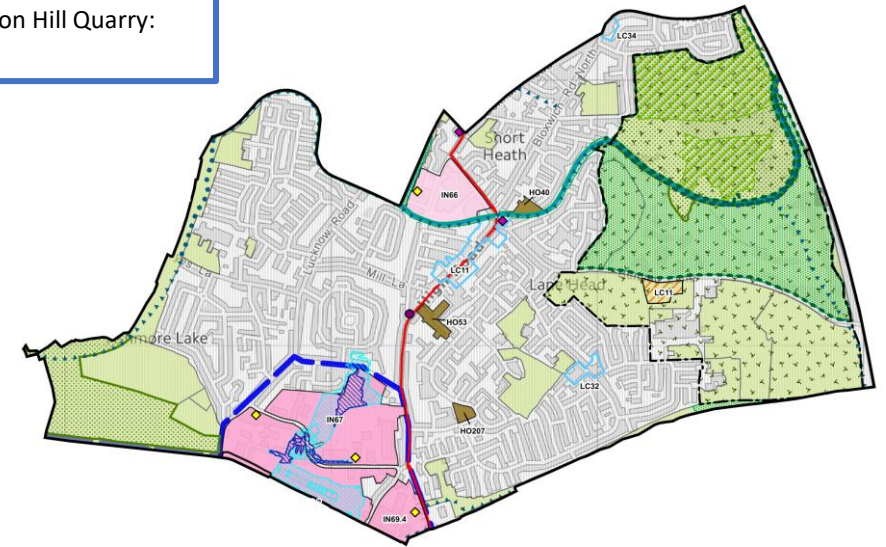
- **Former Brown Jug** – former vacant/derelict property – planning permission for Vets granted in 2019 but has since expired. Potential housing site which was demolished earlier this year by the private owners.

- **Opportunities** for employment use and housing (subject to planning) as set out above.

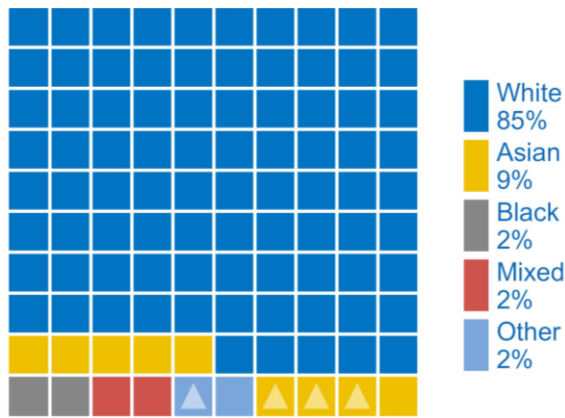

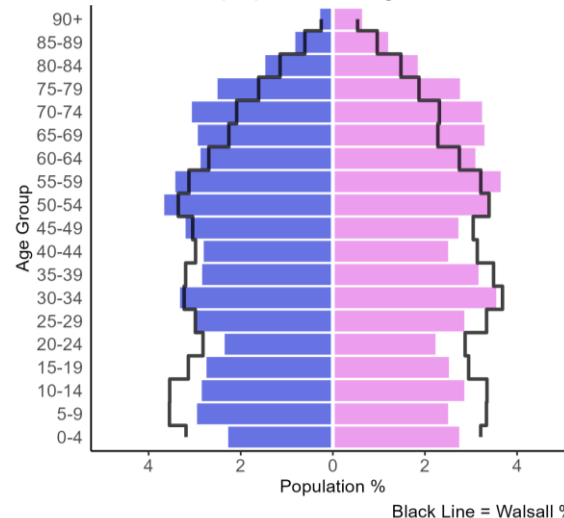

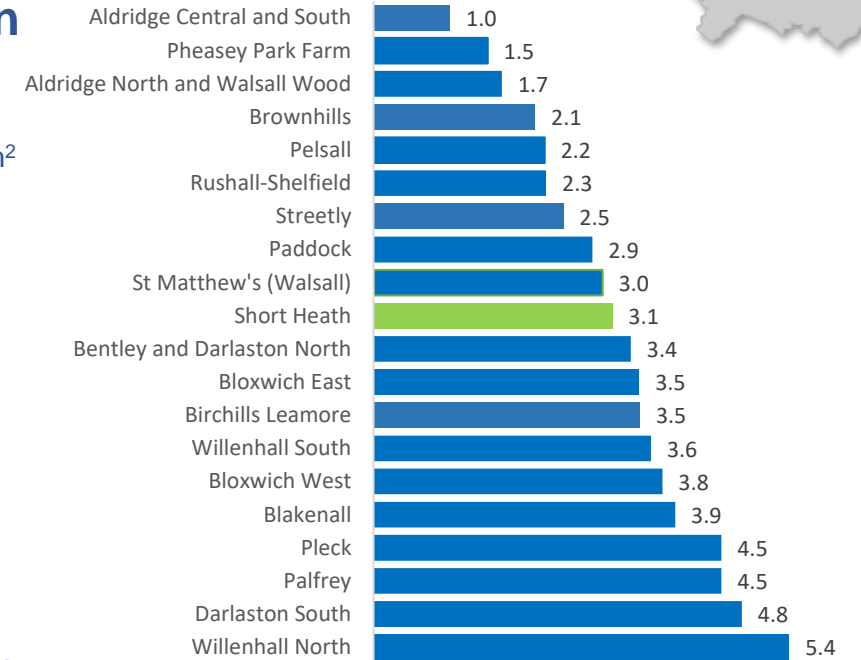
## Population Pyramid

Census 2021, population per km<sup>2</sup>



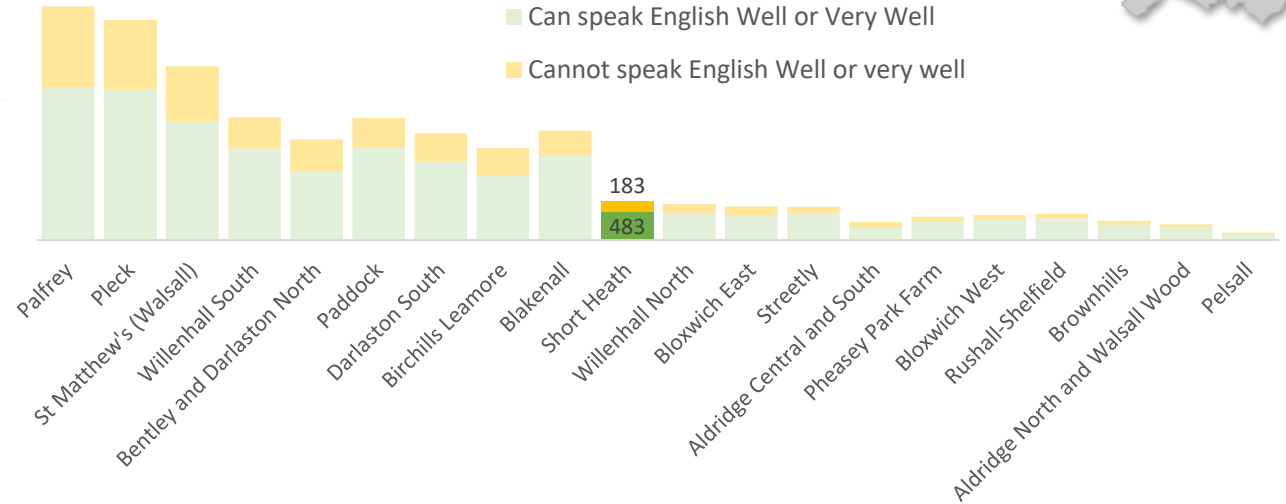
## Key Points:

- Short Heath has a similar age distribution to Pelsall with 4th highest proportion of people over the age of 65yrs. The median age of 45 years old is approximately 6 years above the Borough average (39 years) This is a contrast to the youngest wards, Blakenall and Pleck, both at 32 years.
- The Population Density of Short Heath is in line with average for the borough. There is a substantial area of country park greenspace, equating to just 3,119 people per sq km but around twice as dense as Pheasey.
- Ethnically, the ward is mostly White British (85%), with growing population of Asian (9%) and Other (2%) Groups. Both the Black (2%) and Mixed (2%) populations have remained fairly static since 2011.

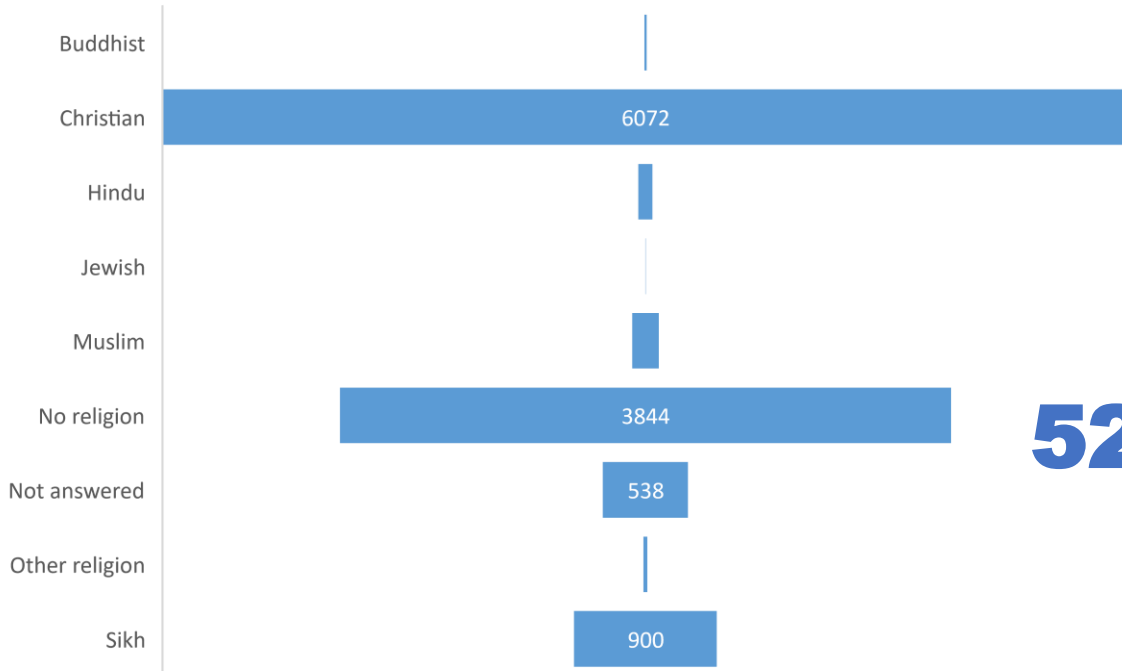
# Language and Religion



**94% of Short Heath's Households where Adults use English as main language**



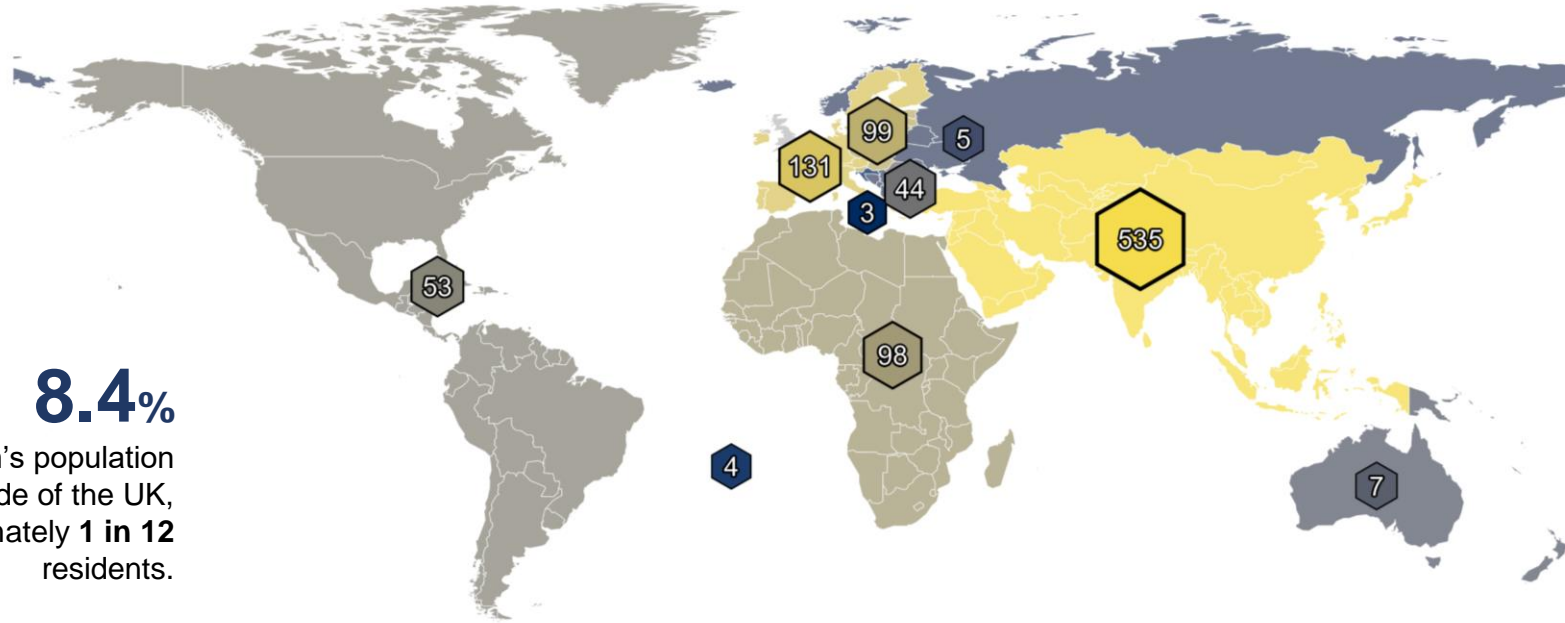
Population by Religion



**52%** household residents are **Christian** ( Borough 45%)

- 96.5% of households have all or at least one adult where English is the main language, compared to 81.1% in Palfrey & Pleck. When English is not the main spoken language, 27% of these residents cannot speak English or cannot speak it well.
- Short Heath has lower than average non-English speakers in households (135) equating to 2.7% of the ward, aligning with Bloxwich East.
- Short Heath ward has a majority population of Christian religion residents (52.1%). This is higher the Walsall borough percentage of 45%. It also has the 4<sup>th</sup> highest percentage of Sikh representation in all of Walsall's wards.
- 33% of Short Heath residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion and a further 4.6% did not answer the census question.

**Global Map of Non-UK Born Residents by Area of Birth**

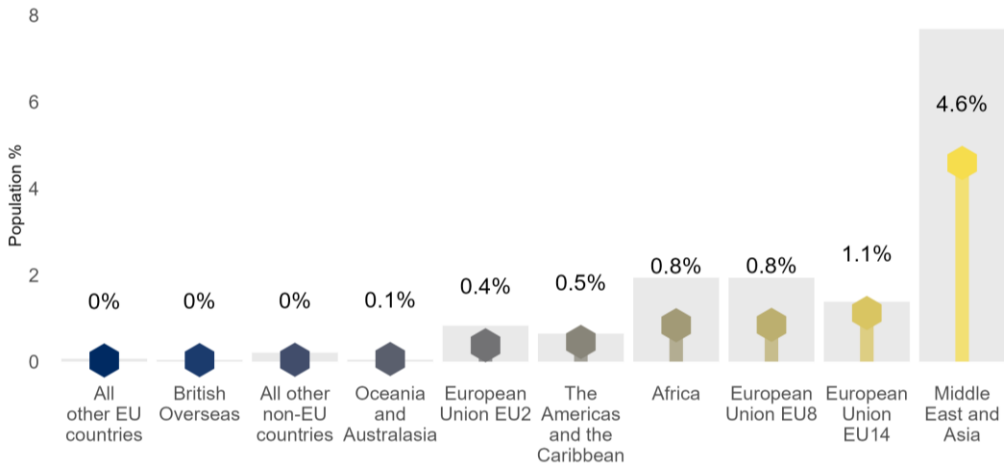

## Key Points:

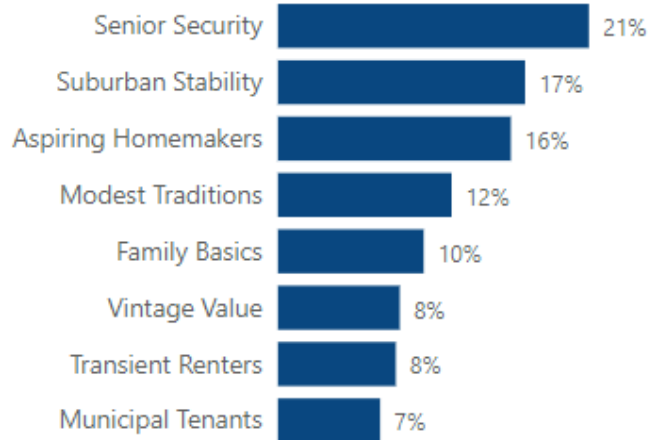
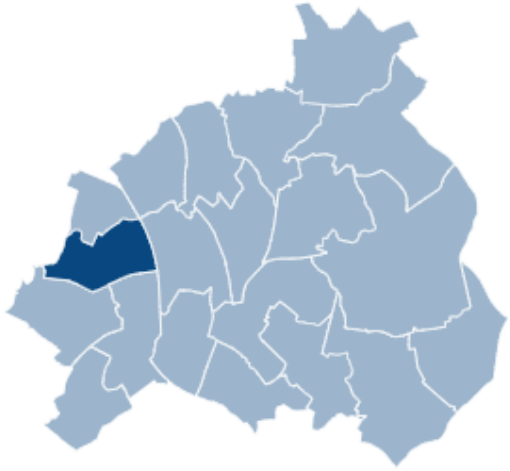
- With 91.6% of residents being UK born, Short Heath has the 11<sup>th</sup> largest proportion of UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- 8.4% of Short Heath's population was born outside of the UK, contrasted with the borough's 14.7%.
- The largest area of non-UK birth is the Middle East and Asia, at around 535 residents or approximately 4.6% (Borough 7.7%). There are also fewer from Africa and EU8 (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia) at approximately 0.8% each.
- The second largest area of non-UK are EU14 born residents: founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain, accounting for 1.1% of the ward's population (131 residents).

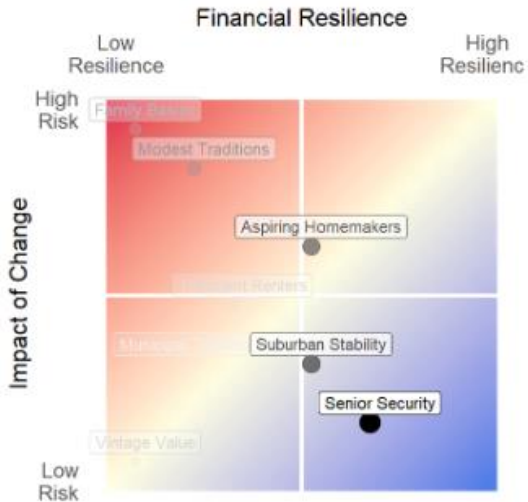


## Social Segment Composition of (% Households)



### Key Points:

- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Short Heath features a wide range of segments, with the largest three being **Senior Security**, **Suburban Stability** and **Aspiring Homemakers**. These are defined on the right of this page.
- 58% of these segments tend to be older, are more affluent, with assets and are more likely to own their own homes. They are largely financially resilient and better able to weather economic shocks.
- The largest segment, **Senior Security** (21% of households), are relatively comfortable pensioners, whom make less use of the internet than other segments and are established within their communities

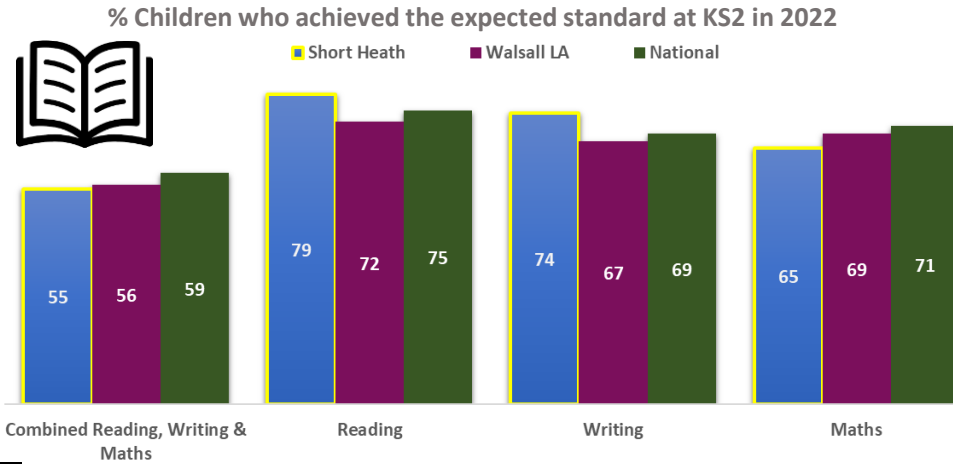

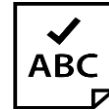


## Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended **any** Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. In Reading and writing, a higher proportion of children in the **Short Heath** ward reached the expected standard than both the Walsall and National averages, although slightly less achieved in maths.

## % Children who reached a good level of development in 2022

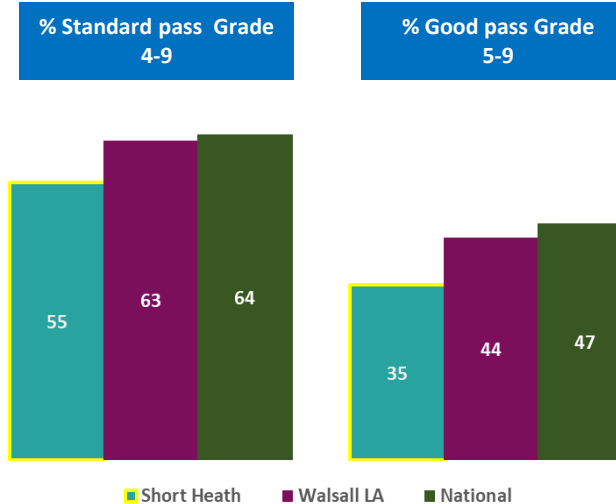


Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59%. A higher proportion of children resident in the **Short Heath** ward achieved a GLD, compared to the LA average and the national average. **Short Heath** ward is ranked 5th highest achieving ward in Walsall.



## Achieving GCSE English and maths in 2022



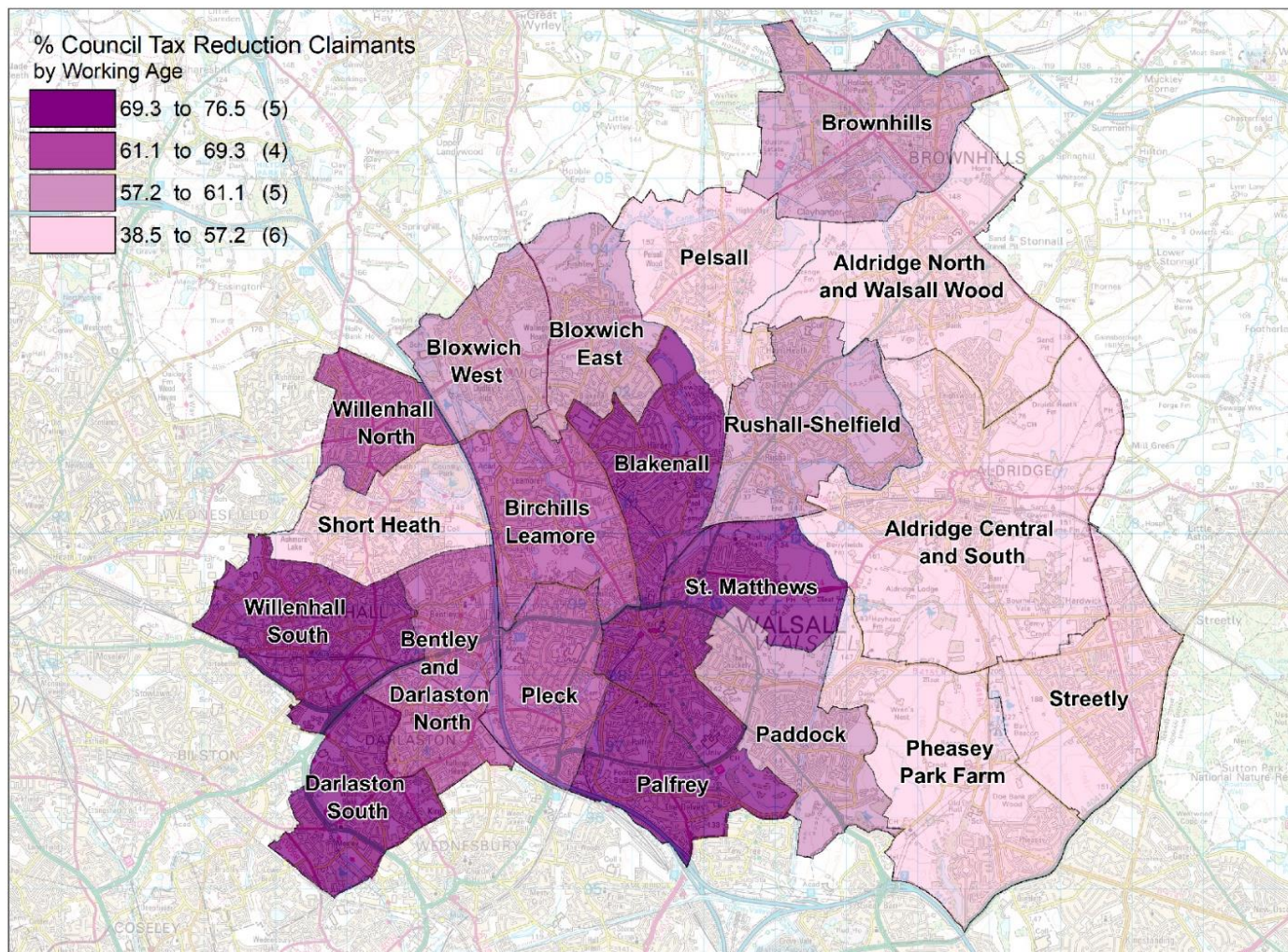
At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. A lower proportion of students resident in the **Short Heath** ward achieve a standard pass at GCSE compared to the LA.

35% students who live in the ward achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE which is 9% lower than the Walsall LA figure and 12% below the National average.

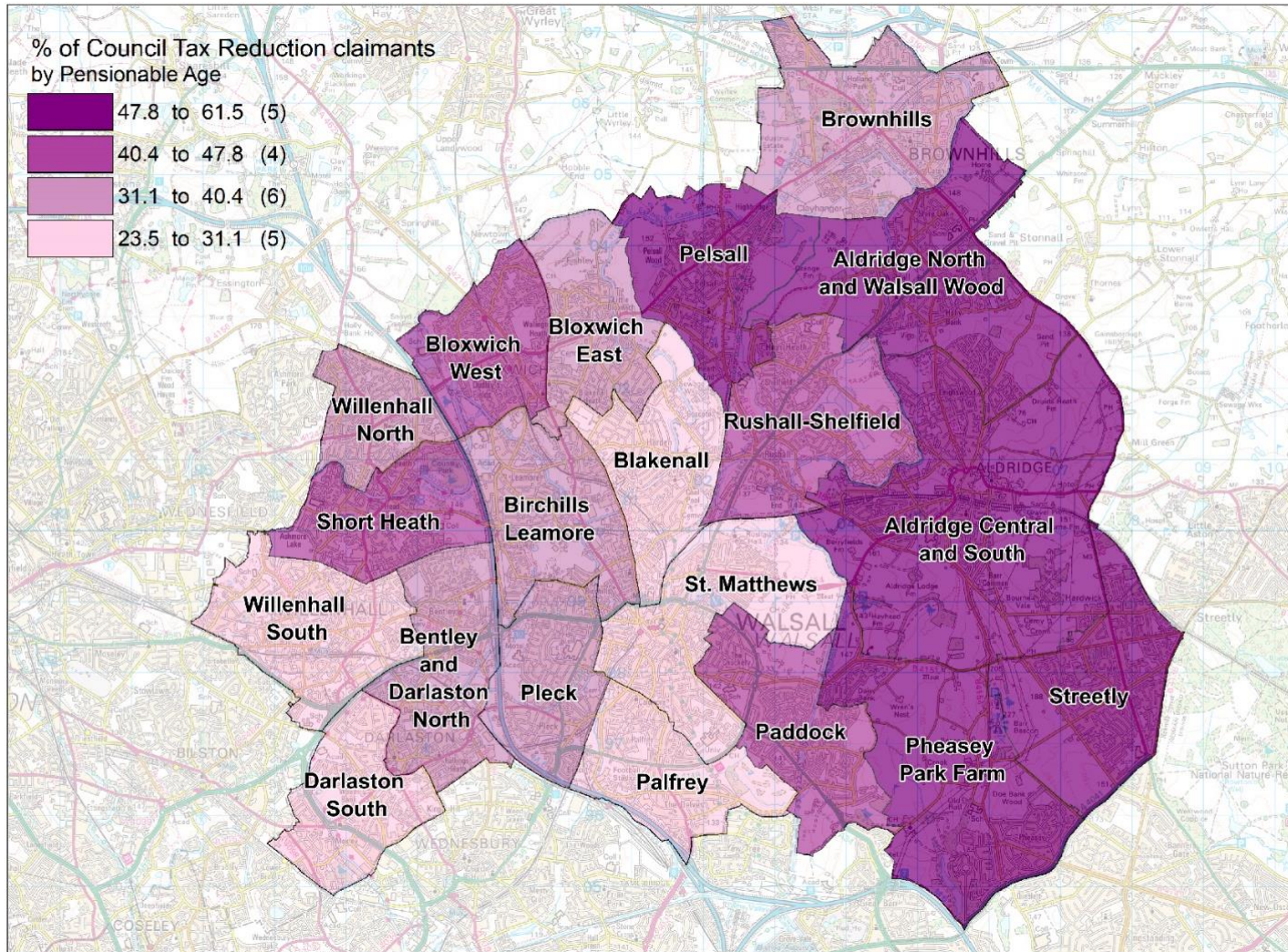

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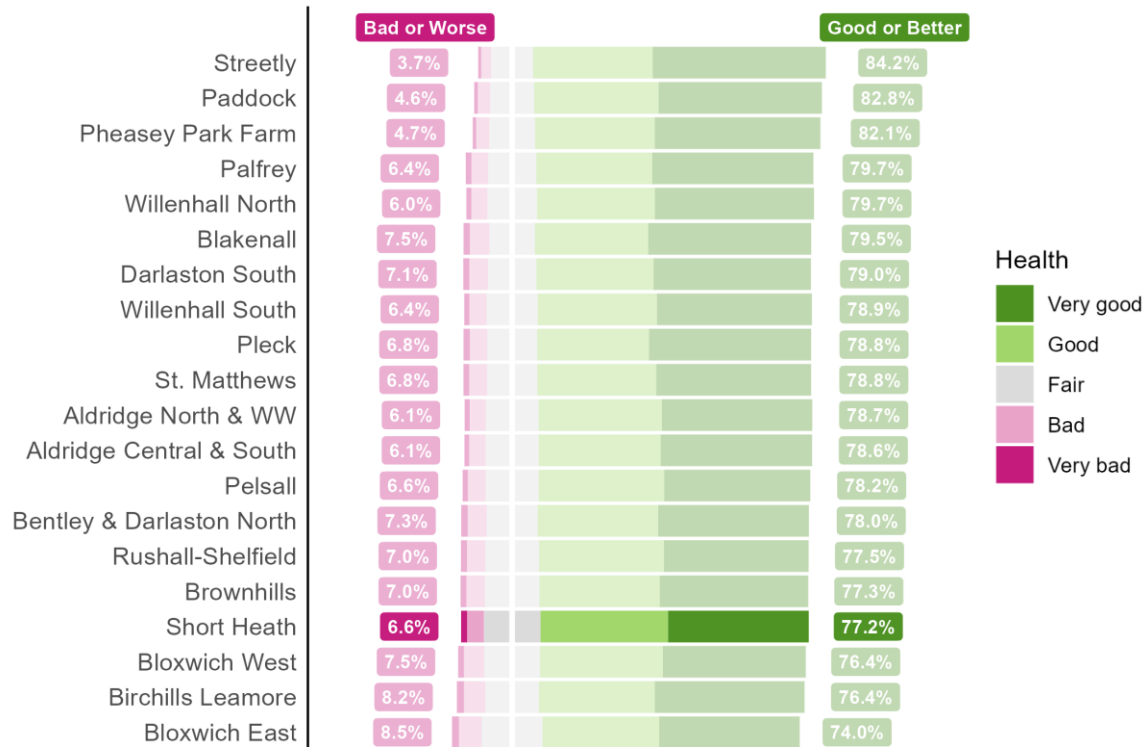

## What is the General Health of Short Heath?

Census 2021, % of resident population



- Short Heath residents report their general level of health as relatively poor compared to most other wards, with 6.6% rated as Bad or Worse. 77.2% rate their general health Good or Better, this is lower than the England average of 82.1%.
- Approximately 1 in 15 residents in Short Heath reported living in poor health or worse compared to approximately 1 in 27 in Streetly (the highest self-reported health in Walsall).

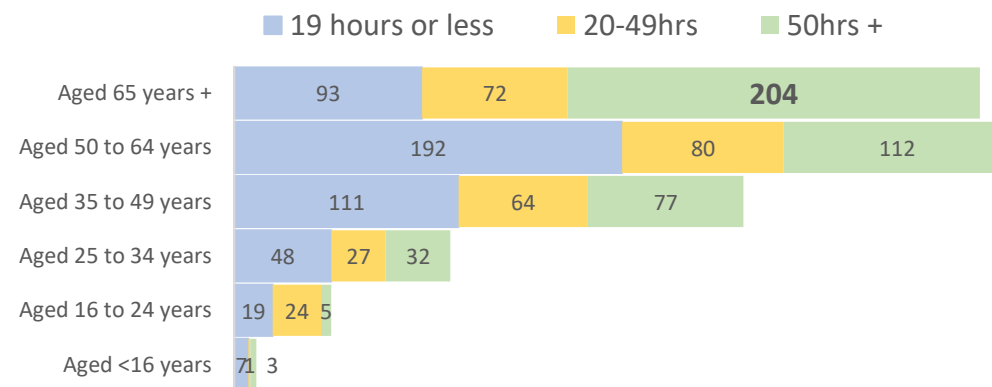

- A further 6.0% have a long term physical or mental Health condition, but daily activities are not limited, this is above that of Walsall overall (5.5%)

Census 2021, resident population (aged 5yrs +)



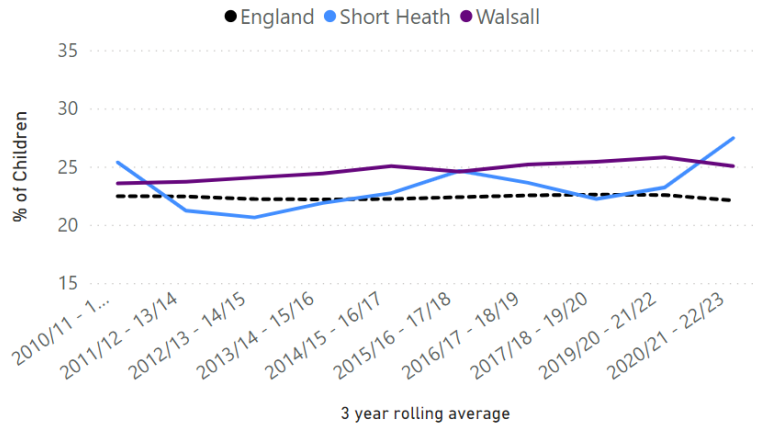
- **2nd Lowest** number of unpaid carers in Walsall, 1,171 compared to Aldridge Central & South with most carers (1,471)

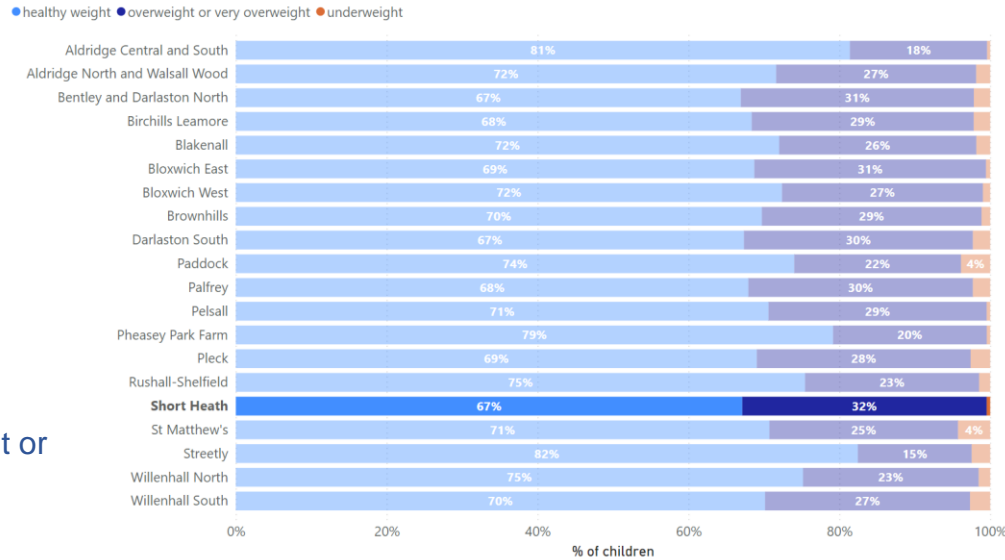

Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Reception Year

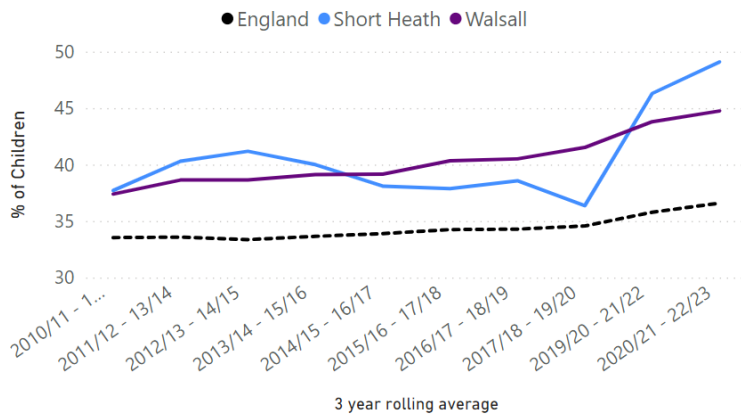


The prevalence of Reception-aged children who are overweight or obese in Short Heath has increased in trend since 2019 and is higher than both the Walsall average and the national rate.

Weight category of children by ward

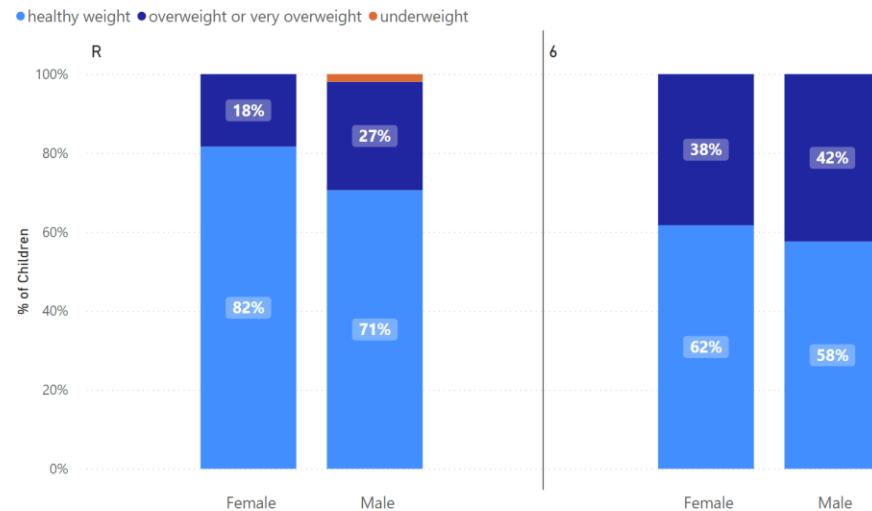


Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Year 6

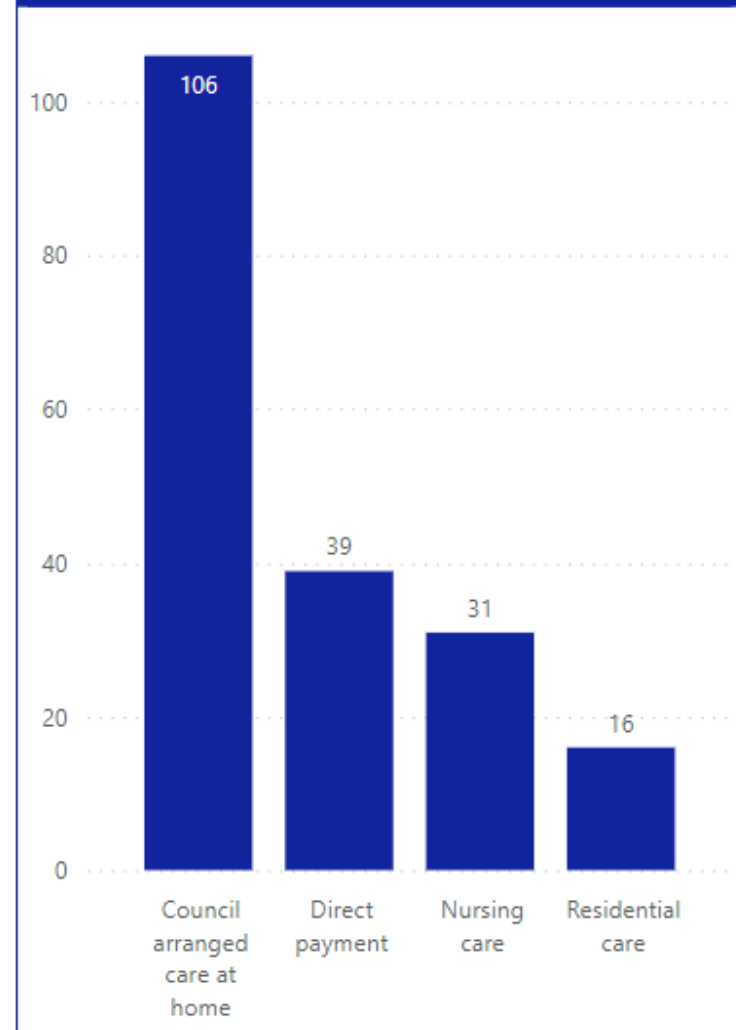

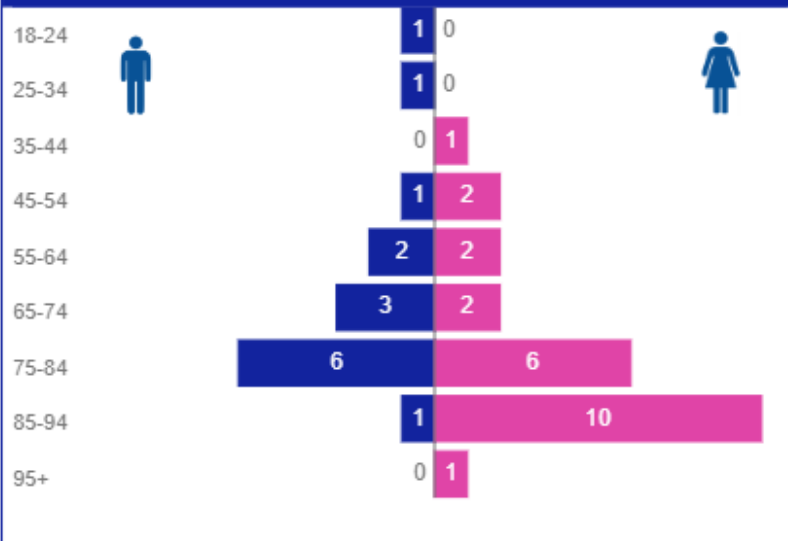

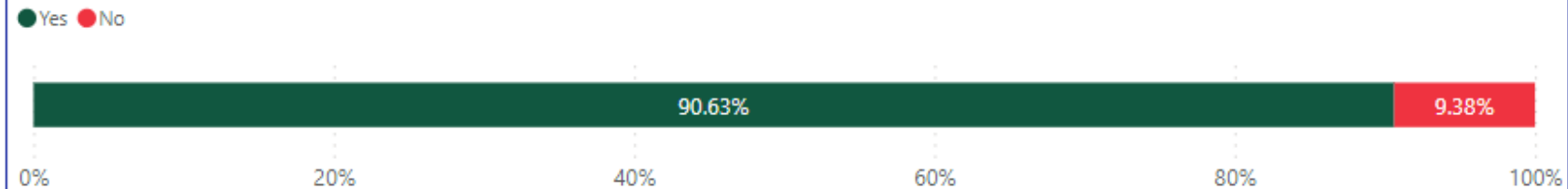
## Respondents by age and gender



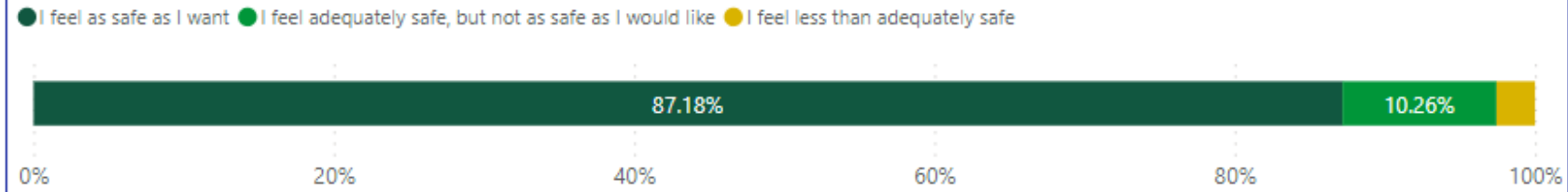
